### Devotional: The Importance of Planning and Faithfulness

**Discipline in budgeting begins with planning.** Proverbs 21:5 highlights the contrast between diligence and haste, showing that thoughtful planning leads to profit, whereas rushing causes loss. In the context of budgeting, this means taking the time to evaluate income, expenses, and savings rather than making impulsive financial decisions.

Jesus teaches in Luke 14:28 the importance of counting the cost before undertaking any project. This principle applies directly to our finances; budgeting is about foresight and responsibility. We are stewards of God's resources, and 1 Corinthians 4:2 reminds us that faithfulness in managing those resources honors God.

## Devotional: Cultivating Godly Self-Control in Spending

**Impulse spending can undermine even the best budgets.** Proverbs 25:28 uses a vivid image to warn us about the dangers of lacking self-control. Just as broken city walls leave a community vulnerable, a lack of financial discipline opens us to unnecessary debt and stress.

Self-control is a fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22–23), meaning it is cultivated by our relationship with God. When faced with temptation to overspend, we can rely on God's faithfulness (1 Corinthians 10:13) to resist and keep our finances on track.

Developing self-control in spending honors God and safeguards our financial health. This discipline not only protects your budget but also reflects spiritual maturity.

Day 3: Navoiding Debt Through Wise Choices

#### Devotional: Choosing Freedom by Avoiding Debt

Debt can be a heavy burden that restricts freedom and peace. Romans 13:8 clearly instructs us to avoid leaving debts unpaid, highlighting that love should be the only ongoing obligation. Proverbs 22:7 reminds us that borrowing places us under the control of lenders, potentially enslaving us and causing stress.

The psalmist contrasts the wicked, who borrow without repayment, with the righteous who live generously. Fostering discipline in budgeting helps prevent unnecessary debt and encourages generosity even within our limits.

When we manage money wisely and avoid debt, we experience greater freedom to serve God and others.

- Luke 21:34–36 "Be careful, or your hearts will be weighed down... Watch out that your hearts are not weighed down with... the anxieties of life..."
- 2 Corinthians 9:6 "Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly..."







#### Devotional: Wisdom in Saving and Preparing

**Saving money is an act of wisdom and discipline.** Proverbs 6:6–8 praises the ant for its foresight and preparation, reminding us to plan ahead rather than live only for the present moment. Saving sets a foundation for security and peace in times of uncertainty.

Jesus warns in Luke 21 to avoid letting worries about life's distractions overwhelm us, which often includes financial anxieties. Managed budgeting that includes saving helps ease those concerns.

2 Corinthians 9:6 encourages generous sowing but within a responsible mindset. Discipline in saving doesn't mean stinginess but wise stewardship that enables blessing others and ourselves.

Embrace saving as a spiritual discipline that honors God and prepares you for future blessings and needs.
