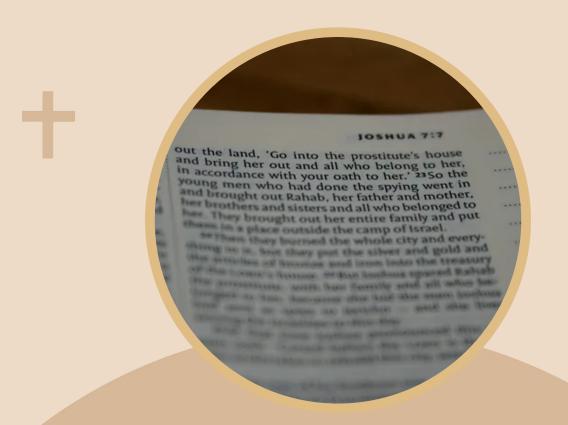

Let's begin with open hearts, ready to receive God's wisdom and joy! 😊 🥎



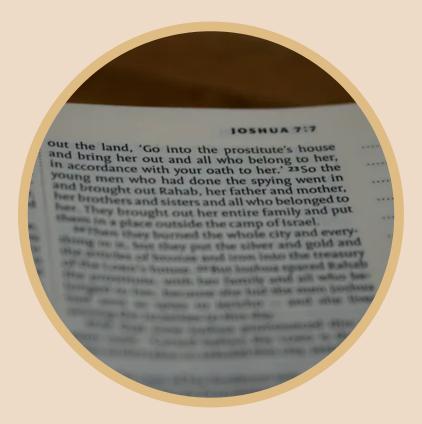


















Day 1: 7 The Blessing of Discipline

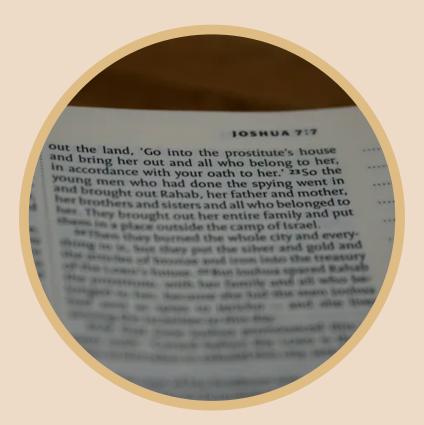

Devotional: Discipline Directs Us Toward Our Godly Goal

Like athletes disciplining their bodies to win a prize, we must exercise spiritual discipline to live joyfully and purposefully.

Philippians 3:14 encourages us to press on toward the heavenly goal with determination. Discipline helps sharpen our focus so we don't get distracted by temporary things. Proverbs 4:25–27 instructs us to keep our eyes fixed on what lies ahead, avoiding detours that slow progress.

Joyful living flows from a disciplined lifestyle aimed at fulfilling God's unique calling for us. Without discipline, distractions multiply and peace diminishes. When we anchor ourselves in God's purposes, discipline becomes empowering rather than burdensome.

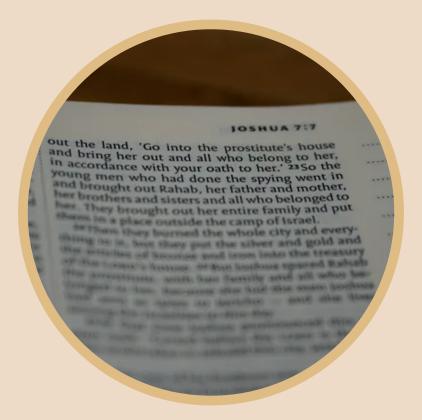

Day 3: Discipline Protects Our Hearts

Devotional: Guarding the Heart Through Godly Discipline

The heart is the wellspring of life, and Proverbs 4:23 emphasizes the importance of guarding it. Discipline is the tool God gives us to protect our hearts from influences that lead to pain and separation from Him. 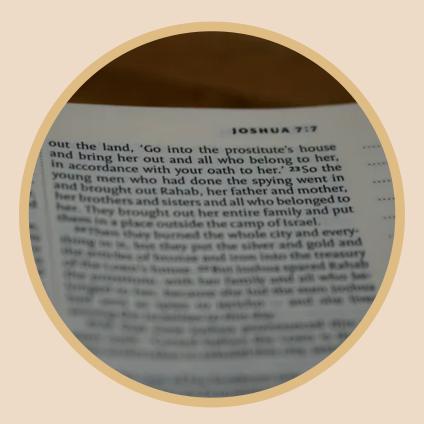

Devotional: God's Loving Refinement Shapes Our Joy

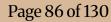
Colossians 3:14 instructs us to 'put on love' over all virtues, showing love as the essential attitude. John 15:12 commands us to love others as Jesus loved us.
