
# Discipline in Obedience to God's Word

#### Devotional: Active Obedience Builds Stronger Faith

Paul models disciplined living by controlling his body and renewing his mind through God's truth. Discipline requires consistency and intentionality, transforming not just our behavior but our hearts and minds.

Reflect on what areas in your life need more intentional discipline to fully obey God's Word. It may involve habits, thought patterns, speech, or relationships. As we deliberately practice God's Word, our faith grows stronger, and we become more Christlike.
