### Devotional: Waiting Quietly Builds Strong Trust

Patience begins with trusting God's timing. Psalm 37:7 calls us to 'be still'—a pause from our anxieties and hurry—and to wait patiently for the Lord. ### Devotional: Trials Train Us to Endure Patiently

### Devotional: Patience as a Fruit of the Spirit's Work

Patience is not just human effort—it is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Galatians 5:22–23 reveals patience (forbearance) as a vital character quality produced in us by God's Spirit. This means our ability to be patient is nurtured as we remain connected to Him.

Romans 8:25 reminds us that waiting in hope is essential and empowered by the Spirit's presence. When we rely on our own strength, impatience crops up quickly. But the Spirit equips us to wait confidently, aware that God's promises are sure.

Paul's encouragement in 2 Timothy 1:7 confirms this is not a timid waiting, but one filled with power, love, and self-discipline. These qualities work together to form a patient heart that reflects Christ's character. Cultivate your relationship with the Spirit daily to grow in this discipline of patient endurance.
