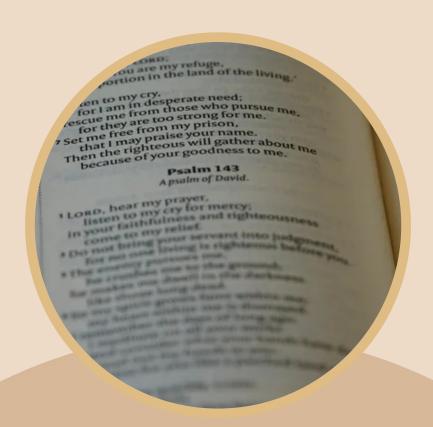
# Discipline in Serving Regularly

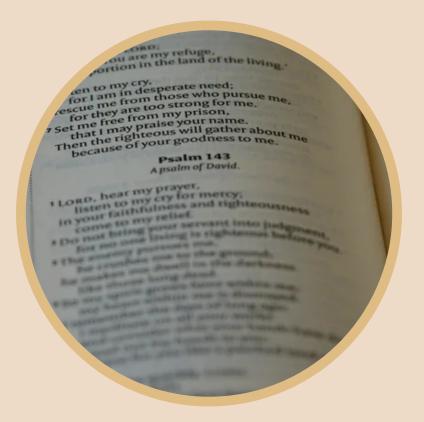

# **Prayer for Today**

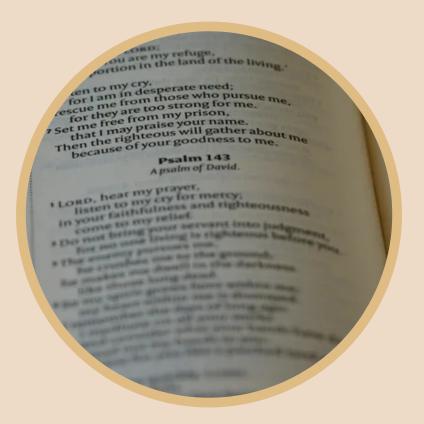

### Devotional: Standing Firm Through Discipline

Father, help me stand firm and unwavering in my commitment to serve.

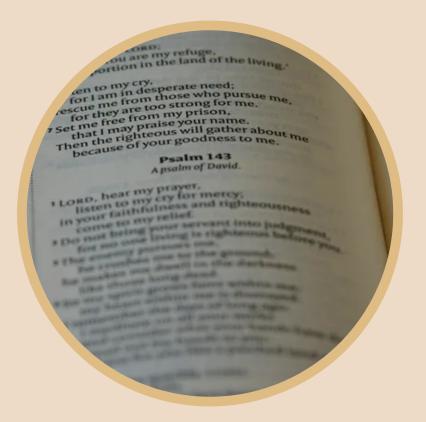

### Devotional: Forming Godly Service Habits

While this verse addresses children, the principle applies to all ages — establishing disciplined habits in service leads to enduring commitment.

# **Prayer for Today**

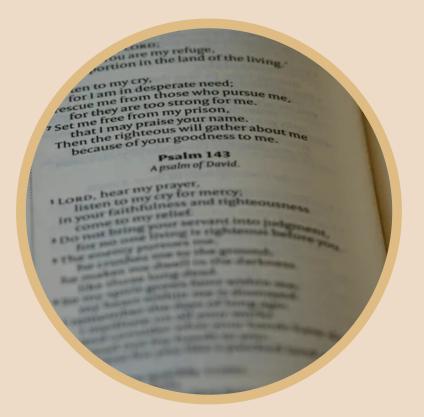
