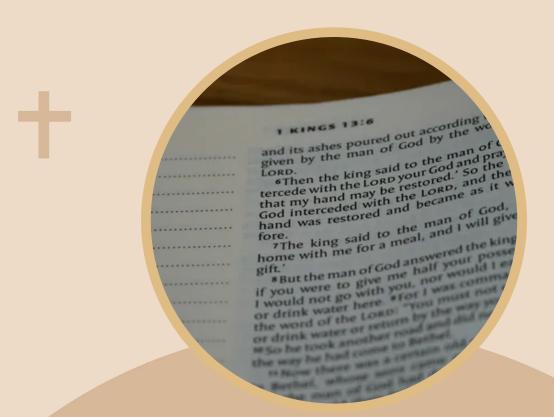

Devotional: The Power of Daily Consistency
