Devotional: Protecting the Heart that Drives Discipline

Our disciplines stem from the condition of our hearts. Proverbs 4:23 teaches us to guard our hearts above all. Laziness often begins with unguarded thoughts or misplaced desires that slowly sap our motivation.

Jesus points out that the heart follows our treasure—what we value determines our energy and engagement. If we treasure fleeting comfort or idleness, our actions reflect that. However, Biblical discipline flows from delighting in God and His Word, which nurtures motivation to stay diligent.
