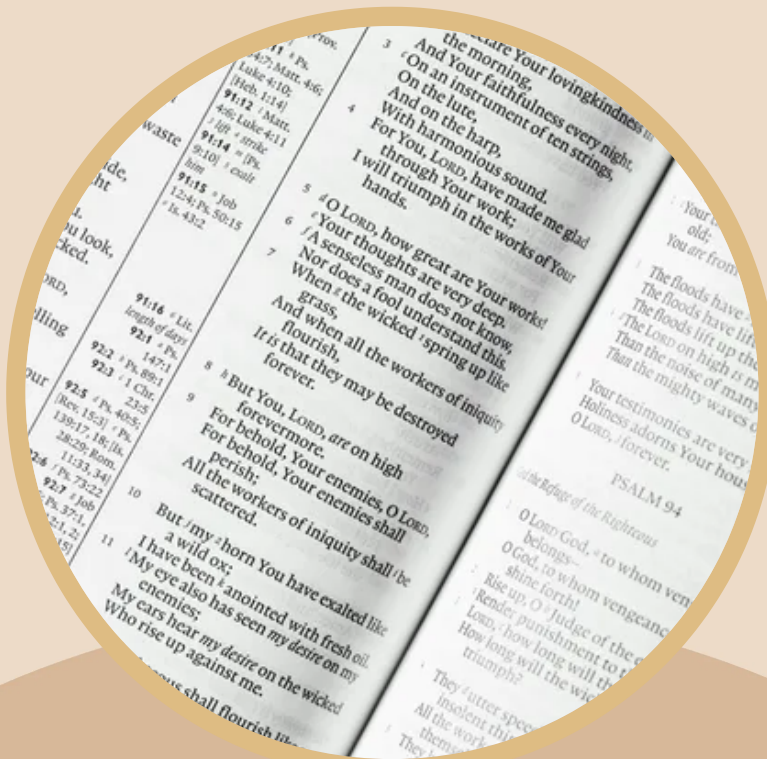

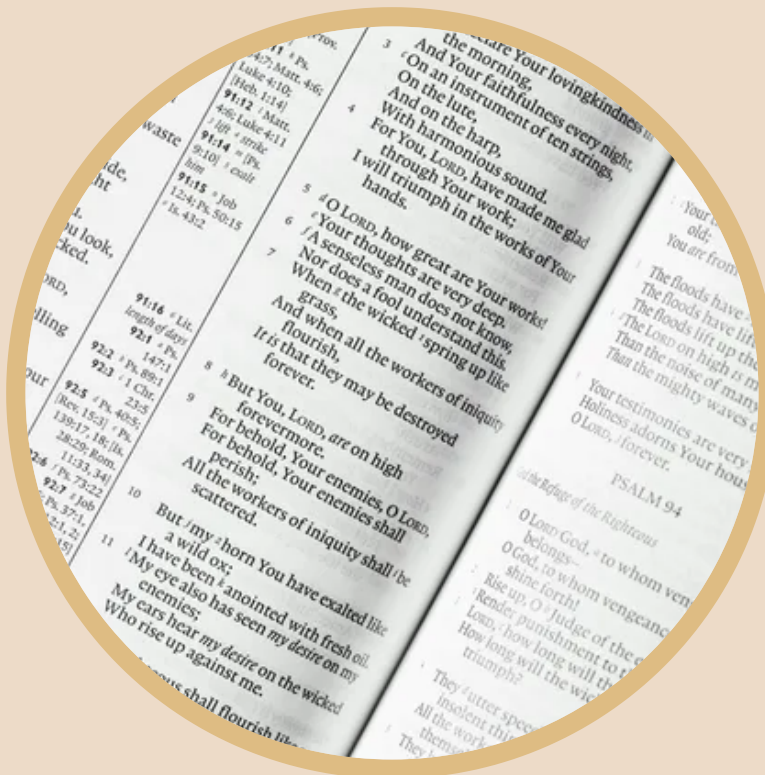

Devotional: The Bible: God's Living Guide for Us

The Bible is unlike any other book. It is inspired by God, which means it carries His authority and life-giving power. In 2 Timothy 3:16, Paul reminds us that every part of Scripture is "God-breathed," meaning God Himself guided its writing to teach us, correct us, and train us in living the right way. It is not merely history or poetry, but a living message from God.

When we approach the Bible with open hearts, it reveals truth about God's nature and His plan for humanity. Hebrews 4:12 portrays Scripture as alive and active, able to discern our inner thoughts and guide our spiritual lives. This means the Bible doesn't just communicate information—it transforms lives.

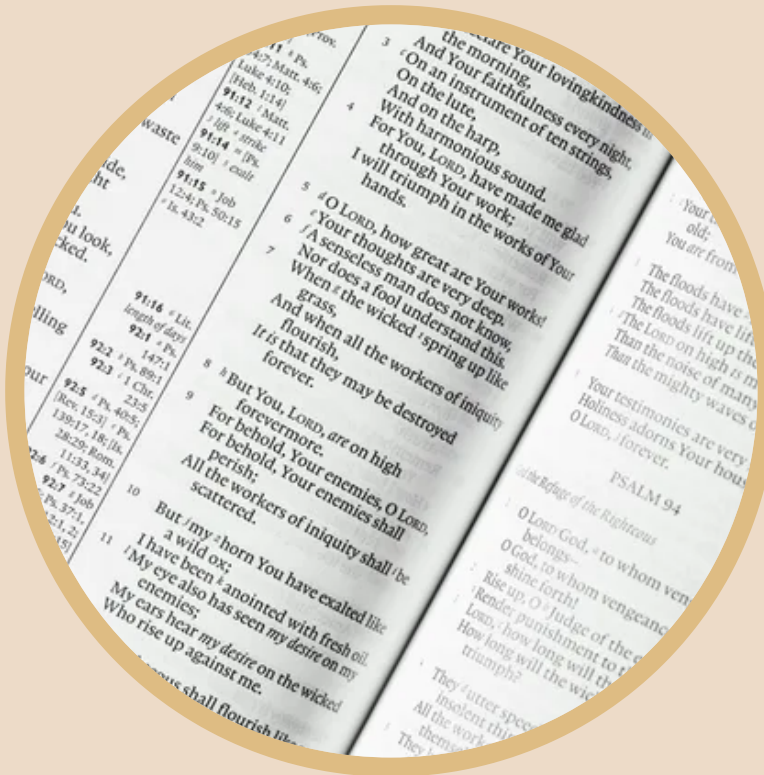
Prayer for Today

Your Verse

Day 2:  Who Is Jesus Christ?

Devotional: Jesus Christ: God With Us and Our Savior


At the heart of Christianity is the person of Jesus Christ. John's gospel opens with an awe-inspiring truth: Jesus is "the Word," who existed with God from the beginning and is Himself God. This means Jesus is not just a historical figure or a wise teacher; He is God in human form, the exact expression of God's nature.

The miracle of the Incarnation—God becoming flesh—reveals God's intimate desire to dwell with us and rescue us. Colossians 2:9 emphasizes that in Christ dwells the fullness of God, showing the unity of divine and human in Jesus. Furthermore, Philippians 2:6–7 explains Jesus' humility, choosing to leave the glory of heaven and take on servant form to fulfill God's plan of salvation.

Understanding who Jesus is helps us grasp what Christianity is truly about: a relationship with God made possible by Jesus' life, sacrificial death, and resurrection. Jesus is the bridge between God and humanity, offering forgiveness and new life to all who believe.

Today, reflect on the wonder of Jesus' identity and His love displayed by coming to live among us. This truth defines Christianity and invites you to trust Him as your Savior and Lord.

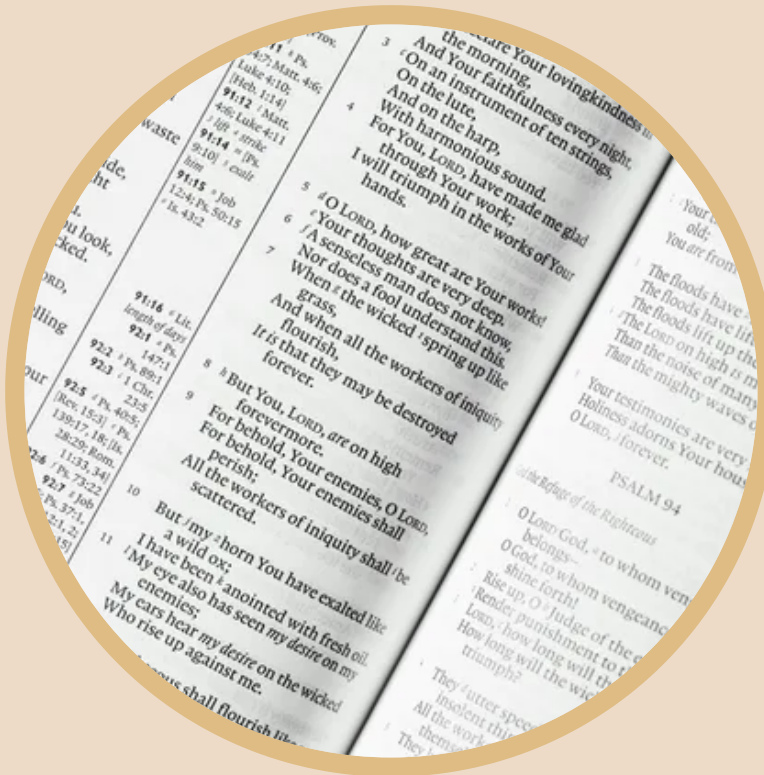
Prayer for Today

Devotional: New Life in Christ: Grace and Transformation

Christianity is not only about who Jesus is but what He does in our lives. When we place faith in Christ, we become new creations as described in 2 Corinthians 5:17. This transformation signifies leaving behind our old ways marked by sin and embracing a fresh start empowered by the Holy Spirit.

This new life reflects the resurrection power of Jesus, as Paul explains in Romans 6:4. Baptism symbolizes this spiritual renewal, showing publicly that we are united with Christ in His death and resurrection. The change is not just external but deeply internal, affecting our desires, choices, and destiny.

Moreover, salvation is a gift of grace from God, not something we earn by our efforts (Ephesians 2:8–9). Understanding this helps us rest in God's mercy and live in joyful obedience, not out of fear or obligation but gratitude and love.

Today, consider what it means to live as a new creation. How can you surrender old habits and draw closer to God? Christianity invites us into abundant life — a journey powered by grace and ongoing transformation.
