Devotional: Trusting God Through History's Story

In Acts, Paul explains that God made all nations from one man, placing them in times and places so they might seek Him. This shows God's intentional involvement—not a distant creator but an active presence in human history.

Doubts about God's existence often arise because of questions about evidence and truth. Exploring biblical history alongside archaeology and the impact of Christianity throughout centuries can help build your confidence. Faith is described as assurance in what we cannot see; it is a reasoned trust that grows as we learn more about God's faithfulness.

Reflect on the storyline in Scripture—a God who promises, acts, disciplines, and redeems. History is not just dates and facts; it's a narrative revealing God's love woven through generations, inviting us to trust Him personally.

Day 3: V Experiencing God Personally

Devotional: Opening Your Heart to God's Presence

Beyond evidence and history, God invites you to know Him personally. Jeremiah promises that those who seek God wholeheartedly will find Him. Faith isn't just about facts; it's about relationship.

Doubt can feel lonely, but God is near, knocking gently on the door of your heart. He speaks in stillness, through Scripture, and in the depth of your own experiences.

Trying to sense God's presence can feel uncertain, but remember that seeking is a powerful step. When you pray openly—sharing your doubts, hopes, fears—you create space to encounter God's love and peace. Jesus describes His followers as those who listen to His voice. Over time, that voice becomes familiar and comforting.

This personal connection transforms uncertainty into confidence and loneliness into belonging. Trust that God pursues you with relentless love and is eager to make Himself known in your life.
