Devotional: The Transformative Power of Discovered Scripture

The discovery of the hidden scroll in 2 Kings 22:8 marks a significant turning point in Judah's history. Hilkiah the priest found the Book of the Law in the temple—likely the Torah or a part of it—long forgotten amidst spiritual decline. This moment reminds us that God's truth remains intact even when concealed or neglected.

Devotional: Responding with a Repentant Heart

Hearing Scripture spoken aloud is a powerful way God communicates with His people. The *Shema*—"Hear, O Israel"—reminds us to listen attentively and respond rightly to God's voice.

Josiah's response challenges us: How do we react when confronted with God's truth? Is it met with conviction, repentance, or indifference? This moment prompts self–examination about our heart posture toward Scripture. The Word not only instructs but convicts, tenderly calling us to change and renewed commitment.

May we, like Josiah, have ears open to God's voice and hearts ready to respond. Listening attentively positions us to be transformed by what we hear.

Devotional: From Hearing to Active Obedience

Devotional: Restoring the Heart's Temple
