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Introduction

The **Book of Zechariah** offers a compelling message of hope, restoration, and divine encouragement to God's people. Written after the exile, Zechariah's prophecies are rich in symbolic visions and promises pointing toward the coming of the Messiah and the ultimate restoration of God's kingdom. Unlike many prophetic books focused mainly on judgment, Zechariah blends calls for repentance with inspiring visions of God's grace and sovereign plan.

Zechariah calls believers to be encouraged in the midst of hardship and uncertainty, reminding us that God's plans to restore and bless His people will prevail. Through a series of night visions, angelic interactions, and hopeful oracles, this short but profound book points toward a future where God's justice, mercy, and peace reign supreme. It's a book that invites reflection on the nature of God's faithfulness and challenges us to live in expectation of His promises.

During these three days, you will encounter several themes—remembering God's steadfast love, understanding the role of repentance and renewal in restoration, and finally, embracing the hope offered by the coming Messiah. Each day includes Scripture, devotional reflections, reflection questions, journaling prompts, and prayers to help deepen your engagement with God's Word.

Let's journey into Zechariah's vision and allow the Spirit of God to illuminate our hearts and minds, encouraging us to live as people of hope and







restoration in today's world.

Devotional: Strength for Restoration Comes From God's Spirit

The first chapter of Zechariah reintroduces the Israelites to a God who calls them not only to repentance but to courageous hope. After years of exile, God's people are trembling, facing opposition and uncertainty about the future. Yet the Lord reminds them—and us—that His Spirit, not human might, will accomplish the restoration of His people. This is a powerful reminder that our confidence should rest in *God's presence and power*, not our circumstances or resources.

Zechariah's visions open with a call to be vigilant and obedient to God's call. We learn that personal and corporate repentance is a vital step toward experiencing God's restoring work. The Lord's anger is not the end; His compassion stirs Him to act for His people's good. As believers today, this passage encourages us to face challenges with courage, trusting that God's Spirit leads and empowers us.

Reflect on the ways you might be relying on your own strength rather than on God's Spirit. How can you turn anew to the Lord's calling with boldness? God's invitation is alive today: come back, be strong, and trust His plan to restore and bless.

Day 2: **B** The Vision of God's Promise and Renewal

Devotional: From Sinful Garments to Righteous Robes

Zechariah's vision of the high priest Joshua standing before the Angel of the Lord highlights a beautiful picture of redemption and renewal. Joshua, representing the people, is accused by Satan but the Lord intervenes, symbolizing that sin has been removed and restoration granted. The removal of filthy garments and the donning of clean robes powerfully symbolize God's forgiveness and new identity bestowed on His people.

This imagery is deeply comforting—it shows that no matter our past or present struggles, God offers a fresh start, cleansing from sin and clothing us with righteousness. This promise reminds us that God's restoration is not just external, but internal; He transforms our hearts and lives.

As you reflect on this passage, consider the ways God has been renewing you. What old burdens or sins does God want to remove? How can you accept the 'fine garments' of new life He offers? This vision calls us to embrace God's grace wholeheartedly and walk confidently in His restoration.

Devotional: Rejoice—The King of Peace Is Coming!

The closing chapters of Zechariah paint a vivid and hopeful picture of the coming Messiah and the advent of God's eternal kingdom. Zechariah prophesies a humble king riding on a donkey, one who brings peace and salvation to His people. This prophecy finds fulfillment in Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and ultimately points toward the consummation of God's redemptive plan.

This promise invites us to rejoice amid trials because the King who has authority over all circumstances is coming. His kingdom is marked not by worldly power but by righteousness, peace, and justice. It is a kingdom where suffering will end, wounds will be healed, and God will dwell with His people forever.

As believers today, we anticipate the return of Christ and the full realization of His kingdom. This hope should shape how we live—reflecting His peace and justice while holding fast to His promises. Let your heart be stirred to joyful expectation, and let that hope empower your walk of faith.
