Devotional: Called to Bear Lasting Fruit

Jesus' choice of His twelve apostles, including James son of Alphaeus, reflects intentionality and purpose. Unlike secular calls for status or power, their calling was to embrace a mission: to be with Jesus, learn from Him intimately, and then go forth to produce lasting spiritual fruit.

For James, this meant a lifestyle devoted to Christ's teachings and empowered by the Spirit. Though the scriptures do not detail his specific actions, we can infer his participation in the foundational work of expanding the early church. This calling challenges us today to consider our own appointment by Christ —to nurture a deep relationship with Him that naturally overflows into service and witness.

Being chosen doesn't guarantee recognition or ease; rather, it affirms purpose and divine empowerment. Trusting this calling compels us to faithfulness amidst uncertainty, just as James exemplified.

Reflecting on James' background helps us appreciate how God's call can influence not just individuals but their wider relational circles. It also encourages believers to support one another in the journey, acknowledging that faith is often nurtured relationally.
