Devotional: Jesus, God's Divine Son Among Us

Devotional: Living in the Hope of Jesus' Resurrection

The resurrection of Jesus Christ anchors our hope eternally. Peter describes this living hope as a new birth through God's mercy, moving us from despair to joy and peace. This hope is not wishful thinking but sure confidence rooted in Jesus' victory over death.

Paul prays that the God of hope fill believers with joy and peace, empowering trust that sustains us through trials. Jesus' own words affirm that belief in Him leads to eternal life beyond the grave.

No matter life's uncertainties, Jesus offers a hope that endures beyond time and circumstance—a hope that transforms and sustains.
