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Introduction

Welcome to this 21-day Bible study dedicated to Thaddaeus, also known as Judas son of James or Lebbaeus. Though he is one of the more obscure disciples mentioned in the New Testament, Thaddaeus played an important role as a follower of Jesus and a witness to His ministry. Over the coming weeks, we will delve into the Scriptures to discover who Thaddaeus was, what qualities he exemplified, and how his faith journey can inspire us all.

In the Gospels, Thaddaeus is often overshadowed by more prominent apostles like Peter, John, and Judas Iscariot. Yet, even the lesser-known disciples were integral to spreading the Gospel and establishing the early Church. Little is directly recorded about Thaddaeus, but this study will guide you through the passages where he is mentioned, as well as explore insights from biblical context, early Church tradition, and applicable lessons for today.

Throughout these 21 days, we will focus on the attributes of faith, courage, loyalty, and service that Thaddaeus embodies. By reflecting on what it means to be a faithful disciple—even when not in the spotlight—we can deepen our understanding of what it truly means to follow Jesus.

This journey invites you to take a closer look at the overlooked parts of Scripture and discover that no disciple is insignificant in God's kingdom. As we walk through passages and reflections daily, may you be encouraged to trust God, step out in faith, and embrace God's calling for your life—just as Thaddaeus did so quietly but faithfully.

Devotional: Meeting Thaddaeus: The Quiet Disciple

Thaddaeus: a name found quietly among the twelve disciples. This opening day invites us to meet Thaddaeus, one of Jesus' twelve closest followers. Though little is directly said about him, he was clearly trusted enough by Jesus to be chosen as an apostle. His other names, Judas son of James and Lebbaeus, remind us how ancient biblical figures often had multiple identifiers, which occasionally cause some confusion.

Being listed among names like Peter and John might make us wonder why Thaddaeus remains so obscure. The Bible often highlights different personalities, and the spotlight does not always fall evenly among them. Yet, the fact that he is named alongside other apostles confirms his active participation in Jesus' ministry.

As we begin, consider the faithful service of those whose stories we rarely hear. Their quiet trustworthiness and presence helped lay the foundation of the early Church, showing that every follower, famous or not, matters deeply in God's plan.

Devotional: Unpacking Thaddaeus' Names and Why They Matter

Thaddaeus is also called Judas son of James. This can be confusing since another disciple, Judas Iscariot, is infamous for betraying Jesus. This scripture (John 14:22) shows a moment when this Judas asked Jesus a question, proving he was engaged and eager to understand.

Multiple names and titles were common in the ancient world. Thaddaeus, meaning 'heart' or 'breast,' may have been a nickname expressing a deep characteristic — perhaps compassion or zeal.

His different names remind us that identity in Christ can be multi-layered, and knowing someone fully takes time and effort. Even within the gospel accounts, each disciple had unique features and roles, shaped by their personalities and faith journeys.

Devotional: Chosen to Serve: Thaddaeus the Apostle

Thaddaeus was one of the chosen twelve apostles. Jesus didn't select just anyone; He chose these men to witness His miracles and preach the Kingdom of God. Being among these twelve was a privilege and a responsibility.

Though we often focus on Peter, James, and John, Thaddaeus shared in the same calling, training, and mission. The twelve were sent to preach, heal, and cast out demons—a significant empowerment for men like Thaddaeus who likely came from humble backgrounds.

His inclusion reminds us that God uses ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things. No role in His kingdom is too small or insignificant.

Thaddaeus was not afraid to ask questions. His inquiry to Jesus shows a desire to understand rather than blind faith. Asking questions is part of growing in faith.

Sometimes, we struggle with doubt or confusion. Thaddaeus' example encourages us to bring these questions to Jesus honestly. God values seekers who pursue understanding sincerely.

Our faith grows when we engage deeply, wrestle with doubts, and seek God's wisdom. This posture draws us closer to Christ, just as it did for Thaddaeus.

Being sent means embracing uncertainty and challenges for the sake of the Gospel. It requires faith, courage, and obedience.
