Devotional: The Bible: God's Living and Powerful Word

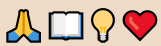

- *Genesis 1:1 - "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."*
- *John 1:1 - "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."*



Devotional: God's Spirit Inspired the Bible's Message

The Bible is unique not only because of who inspired it but also because of how it was given. 2 Peter 1:20–21 assures us that Scripture does not originate from human ideas but from God through the Holy Spirit working among the prophets. This divine inspiration guarantees the Bible's authority and truth, transcending history and culture.

The Bible spans many centuries and writings, beginning with the book of Genesis, which opens with the profound truth of God's creative power: "In the beginning, God created..." (Genesis 1:1). The Bible's narrative unfolds God's relationship with humanity, from creation, fall, redemption, to restoration.

John 1:1 introduces Jesus as the eternal Word, emphasizing that the Bible points us to Him.
