For example, Luke the physician recounts in *Luke 1:3* how he investigated everything carefully before crafting his orderly account of Jesus' life. This demonstrates that the writers often researched and considered their narratives carefully — their writings are intentional and historically grounded.

Recognizing the Bible's human authors helps us appreciate the richness of its literary styles and the diversity of perspectives unified by one divine truth. These men's lives and contexts reflect how God chose to communicate His message across different eras and circumstances.
