# Devotional: Moses: God's Chosen Lawgiver

Moses stands as one of the Bible's central human authors, credited with writing the first five books—commonly called the Pentateuch or Torah. As a shepherd turned leader, Moses experienced God's power firsthand through the burning bush and the plagues of Egypt. His heart for God's people and his obedience in recording God's law shaped the foundation of Israel's identity. Writing amidst journeying wilderness and encounters with God, Moses combined historical narrative, laws, and poetry to guide God's people in covenant relationship.

Think about Moses' role: chosen, reluctant, yet faithful. His writing was not simply information but a divine covenant invitation. The words he penned hold authority because they root in God's revelation and Moses' life with Him. As you reflect, consider how the laws show God's holiness and people's need for grace—a theme echoed throughout Scripture, reaching fulfillment in Christ.


