The story of Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch, found in **Acts 8:26–40**, stands as a profound example of how God orchestrates divine appointments, guiding His followers to bring salvation to unexpected places. This Bible study plan invites you to walk through this compelling narrative over 21 days, uncovering rich lessons about obedience, faith, evangelism, and God's sovereign timing.

Philip's encounter with the Ethiopian eunuch is more than a historical event; it exemplifies the beautiful intersection of God's providence and human response. The Spirit directed Philip on a journey that led to an unplanned meeting, resulting in the eunuch's salvation and baptism. This encounter reveals how God uses ordinary people—when obedient—to fulfill His extraordinary purposes.

Throughout these 21 days, you'll study the context, characters, and spiritual truths surrounding this story. You will learn how divine appointments can challenge us to step out of comfort zones, trust God's leading, and be ready to share the gospel in situations that may seem unlikely or unexpected. Each day will guide you deeper into Scripture, supporting passages, reflection questions, and prayer, enabling you to see how God's plan moves forward through obedience.

Whether you are new to the Bible or seeking fresh insights, this plan will inspire and equip you to recognize and respond to God's invitations in your







daily life. Be encouraged that the same Spirit who led Philip is at work today, calling you to be faithful in the divine appointments God has for you. Let's begin this journey with open hearts, ready to experience the power of obedience and the joy of bringing salvation to others just as Philip did for the Ethiopian eunuch.

#### Devotional: Beginning with Trust and Obedience

**Divine appointments** are moments where God intentionally orchestrates encounters to fulfill His purposes. In *Acts 8:26*, an angel directs Philip to a seemingly random road—a desert road leading from Jerusalem to Gaza. Such direction might have seemed inconvenient or risky, but Philip obeys without hesitation. This sets the stage for a powerful meeting between Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch.

We often miss divine appointments because we rely solely on our understanding or plans. Yet, God desires us to trust Him and follow His lead, even when the path isn't clear or comfortable. The road Philip was told to take was not a popular one, but it was the path God chose for a life-changing encounter.

As you begin this study, open your heart to recognizing the subtle and not-so-subtle ways God might be directing your steps. Divine appointments require responsiveness and trust. You might feel uncertain or even hesitant, yet God's purposes will always bring greater good. Like Philip, be prepared to step out in obedience and watch what God does in and through you.

#### Devotional: Listening to the Spirit's Voice

Philip's obedience is not merely human will; it is a response to specific guidance from the Holy Spirit. In *Acts 8:29*, the Spirit instructs Philip to approach a particular chariot. This moment reminds us that the Holy Spirit cares about the details of God's plan and actively participates in directing believers.

Many believers desire to be led by the Spirit but struggle to discern His voice. The Spirit's guidance often comes through Scripture, prayer, a peace in the heart, or circumstances aligned with God's will. When Philip heeded the Spirit's direction to go near the eunuch's chariot, it opened the door for evangelism and conversion.

Being led by the Spirit involves a posture of attentiveness and submission. It may require putting aside personal plans or assumptions to align with God's timing and purpose. Today, ask the Spirit to sharpen your ability to hear and respond to His voice. Remember, divine appointments are birthed from Spirit-led obedience.

#### Devotional: Seeing and Seizing Divine Opportunities

When Philip approached, he observed the eunuch reading Scripture but clearly missing the full meaning. Divine appointments are not always obvious at first glance. They require spiritual insight and sensitivity—as well as initiative—to move from observation to engagement.

Philip's simple but poignant question—"Do you understand what you are reading?"—opened dialogue and trust. Divine appointments seldom happen if we do not recognize the opportunities and take action. Life is filled with fleeting moments where God wants to work if only we notice and respond.

This day, meditate on your surroundings. Are there people curious but confused about God's Word? Divine appointments can come through everyday interactions. God uses them to bring clarity, hope, and salvation. Pray for eyes to see and a heart willing to approach those who may need your kindness, insight, or testimony.

The Scripture the eunuch reads is a prophecy about Jesus—the suffering servant who would die for humanity's sins. This passage has the power to convict, teach, and bring understanding. Philip uses Scripture to guide the eunuch's heart and mind toward salvation.

God's Word is not just informative; it is transformative. The Bible awakens faith, reveals truth, and invites response. Philip's gift to the eunuch is intentional explanation, helping him see himself in the story of redemption.

Reflect today on how Scripture has impacted your life. Maybe God is calling you to share His Word with someone who needs it like the eunuch did. Consider inviting God to use your knowledge and passion for His Word to open hearts and bring clarity.

Our spiritual journey involves asking questions—about God, purpose, and salvation. God welcomes honest seeking and responds to those who earnestly desire truth. Sometimes, others' questions can be divine appointments to strengthen our faith or share what we know.

Consider what questions you have about your faith, and don't be afraid to pursue answers. Also, be attentive when others ask questions. Your response might be the key to unlocking their understanding and leading them toward Christ.

The eunuch immediately desires baptism upon understanding the gospel, demonstrating obedience and faith. Baptism is an outward sign of the inward transformation and commitment to Christ. It symbolizes death to the old self and new life in Jesus.

Philip does not hesitate to baptize the eunuch, illustrating readiness to obey God's commands and meet spiritual needs promptly. Many times, obedience requires swift action when God opens a door, especially in evangelism and disciple–making.

Reflect on your own obedience in responding to God's commands. Are you prepared to follow promptly, even when it means stepping into unexpected service or action? God's kingdom advances through faithful and immediate responses to His prompting.

True discipleship involves daily surrender and willingness to go where God leads, even if it disrupts personal plans. Divine appointments may come disguised as interruptions or challenges, yet they are vital for God's work.

Consider areas of your life where convenience tempts you to ignore God's call. Ask for strength to choose obedience, trusting God's ways are best.
