1 Corinthians 15:20 NIV – "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep."

- John 11:25 "Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die;"

Devotional: Understanding Christ's Resurrection Power

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"
- Ephesians 2:4-5 "Because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved."







Devotional: Embracing New Life Through the Spirit

New life is the promise Easter brings, a fresh start rooted in Jesus Christ.

Romans 8:11 reminds us that the same Spirit who raised Jesus is alive in us, offering life to our mortal bodies. This means we don't just have eternal hope after death — we experience newness here and now through the Holy Spirit.

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 5:17 affirm this transformation: anyone in Christ becomes a new creation. The old, with its sins and regrets, is gone. Easter is not just a celebration; it's a life-altering reality inviting us to walk in freedom, joy, and renewed purpose.

Furthermore, Ephesians 2:4–5 highlights God's incredible mercy and grace in bringing us to life even when we were spiritually dead. This love fuels our gratitude and compels us to live in hope and faith.

- Colossians 2:6-7 "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness."







Devotional: Living a Life Overflowing with Thanks

Gratitude is a natural response to the gift of Easter — the salvation and love God freely offers us. Psalm 107:1 exhorts us to give thanks because God's love is endless and steadfast. This love was demonstrated most profoundly in Christ's sacrifice and resurrection.

The early church understood the importance of gratitude. Paul encourages believers in 1 Thessalonians 5:18 to give thanks in every situation as it aligns us with God's will. Gratitude shifts our perspective from what we lack to the abundance we have in Christ, fostering joy and peace.

Colossians 2:6-7 reminds us to continue growing in faith, rooted in Jesus and overflowing with thankfulness. Easter is not just an annual occasion but a continual attitude of heart.
