Devotional: Embracing the Living Hope of Easter

- Hebrews 2:14 "Because God's children are human beings... he shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death."







Day 2: T Victory Over Death

Devotional: Living in Freedom from Death's Power

Death had once seemed the ultimate enemy, but Easter declares it defeated. Paul reminds us in Romans 6:9 that Christ's resurrection means He conquered death once and for all. Because Jesus lives, death no longer holds sway over our eternal destiny.

John 14:27 - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:7 "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Devotional: Receiving Easter's Gift of Peace

Beyond hope and victory, Easter offers us peace that the world cannot replicate. Jesus' words in John 14:27 remind us that His peace calms troubled hearts and dispels fear. This peace is deeply rooted in the resurrection reality —because Christ lives, we can rest confidently in Him.

Day 4: 6 Living Resurrection Power

Your Verse

Ephesians 1:19–20 – "His incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 3:10 "I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection."
- Colossians 3:1 "Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above."







Day 4: 6 Living Resurrection Power

Devotional: Empowered by Resurrection Strength

Easter's hope is not passive; it empowers us with resurrection power for daily living. Paul describes this power as the very strength God used to raise Jesus from the dead. This power is available to believers and changes how we live, face challenges, and grow spiritually.
