Devotional: Welcomed Like Children: Opening to God's Grace

In Matthew 19:13–15, we see a beautiful scene where children are brought to Jesus, and the disciples attempt to turn them away. But Jesus stops them with a loving rebuke and says, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these" (v. 14).

This passage reveals the profound value Jesus places on childlike faith. Children naturally exhibit trust without skepticism, dependence without pride, and openness without judgment. These qualities resonate deeply with the Kingdom of Heaven, where entrance is defined not by status or achievements but by a heart open to receive God's grace.

Jesus' welcome of the children symbolizes that the Kingdom is accessible to all, especially those who humbly recognize their need for God. It challenges us to examine if we approach God with the same simplicity and trust. Is our faith marked by openness and dependence, or are we trying to earn our place through our own efforts?

Embracing a childlike faith invites us to relearn trust, hope, and humility, unlocking the grace that Jesus freely offers. Let us begin this journey by reflecting on how Jesus values and welcomes us just as we are—inviting us to come with hearts wide open.

Devotional: Faith as Simple Trust Unlocks God's Kingdom

Today's passage in **Luke 18:15–17** reiterates Jesus' teaching about childlike faith as a necessity for entering God's Kingdom. When the children were brought to Him, Jesus said, "*Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.*"

This statement challenges preconceived notions of strength and maturity. God's Kingdom invites faith that is not based on intellectual mastery or worldly power but on simple, unwavering trust. A child trusts their parent implicitly without demanding proof or control—so must we trust God.

John 1:12 reinforces this—believing in Jesus gives us the right to become God's children, heirs of His Kingdom. This transformation hinges on acceptance and faith rather than achievement.

Paul's words in **Romans 11:20** remind us that faith is what keeps us rooted in grace. Like children who learn by depending on their parents, we are called to stand firm by trusting in God's promises.

Reflect on areas in your life where trust may feel difficult. Childlike faith does not mean ignoring challenges, but choosing to believe God's goodness and control above all. Today, embrace faith as a simple, powerful key that opens the gate to the Kingdom.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What does it mean to you to 'receive the kingdom like a little child'?
2.	How has your faith grown when you chose to trust God despite uncertainty?
3.	Are there doubts or fears that keep you from fully depending on God?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about how trusting God as a child trusts a parent could change your perspective.
2.	Identify one area where you struggle to surrender control to God.
3.	List scriptures or promises that encourage you to keep faith strong.







Prayer for Today

Gracious Father, thank You for the gift of faith, a simple yet powerful trust in You. Teach me to receive Your Kingdom like a child—with openness, humility, and confidence in Your love. Help me to rest in Your promises even when life feels uncertain or challenging. Strengthen my heart to stand firm and to depend fully on Your grace each day. Devotional: Embodying Grace Through Childlike Humility

In **Matthew 18:1–5**, the disciples asked Jesus who is greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven. His answer was surprising: "Unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (v. 3). Jesus elevates childlike qualities—humility, dependence, and sincerity—as marks of true greatness.

Our faith is sustained by God's grace, freely given to us as **Ephesians 2:8-9** reminds us. This grace is not earned but received, much like a child receives love and provision without calculation.

Psalm 131:2 offers an image of a calm and quiet soul, content and trusting. Living with childlike faith allows us to surrender worries and self-reliance, resting peacefully in God's care daily.

Today challenges you to embrace grace not only as a theological concept but as a lived reality. To be 'great' in God's eyes is to live each day with the humility and trust of a child, welcoming God's forgiveness, guidance, and love continuously. Ask God to help you embody this spirit in your relationships, decisions, and challenges.

Childlike faith transforms how we live, making grace the foundation of all we do. Let us commit to this journey, walking hand in hand with God as beloved children.

1.	How does Jesus' definition of greatness challenge your own views?
2.	What does living by grace look like in your daily life?
3.	How can you cultivate a calm and trusting soul amid life's pressures?

3.	Commit to one daily habit that nurtures childlike faith and trust.
