Day 1: ① Strength in Surrender

### Devotional: God's Power Shows in Our Weakness

Admitting weakness is a difficult step for many, especially those who have been trained to be self-reliant like veterans. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12:9 offer hope as he reveals a key spiritual insight: God's power shines brightest when we admit our limitations and surrender to Him. Our weakness opens room for His unstoppable strength.

It's tempting to rely solely on personal grit, but Scripture invites us to acknowledge our need for God's grace and, by extension, the help He provides through others. Surrendering isn't about giving up; it's about allowing God to work in and through our vulnerabilities. When we release the pressure to do it all alone, we position ourselves to receive divine empowerment.

Today, reflect on areas where you might be holding on to pride or self-sufficiency. Are there needs or fears you have tried to carry silently? Consider how God's grace meets those places when you surrender. Remember, strength and surrender go hand in hand, ushering in transformative spiritual growth.

When we carry our burdens alone, they quickly become overwhelming. Yet, when shared with others, burdens become lighter and hope is renewed. Hebrews encourages us not to neglect meeting together, as regular fellowship builds resilience and keeps faith vibrant.

# Devotional: Prayer Unlocks Healing and Connection

Prayer is a powerful means of support that connects believers with God and with one another. James instructs us to confess and pray for each other, highlighting the healing offered through the shared experience of prayer.

Often, pride or fear stops us from asking others to pray, but true freedom comes when we openly invite others into our struggles through prayer. Doing so refreshes our spirits and builds deep trust within Christian community.

Philippians encourages us to bring all our anxieties to God through prayer with thanksgiving, fostering peace when worries mount. Meanwhile, 1 Thessalonians reminds us that prayer is not just a practice for times of crisis but a continual lifeline sustaining us.

Accepting and requesting prayer is an act of faith—an acknowledgment that we need God and each other. Let today be a step toward uniting your heart with others' prayers and experiencing healing and strength through this sacred exchange.

Day 4: P Honest Confession Heals

### Devotional: The Freedom in Honest Confession

Confession is a vital step in breaking down pride and embracing community support. Psalm 32 beautifully depicts the relief and forgiveness that come from honesty before God. Covering sins breeds shame and isolation, but confession brings freedom.

John's first epistle reminds us that God remains faithful and just to forgive when we confess. Moreover, James goes further by encouraging confession not only to God but also to trusted believers, so we may experience healing together.

Many veterans know the weight of hidden struggles. Opening up to someone trusted can be scary, but it is also a powerful step toward transformation and deeper connection. Prayer grows stronger when paired with transparency.

Today, be encouraged to honestly confront areas you have hidden. Seek safe community for confession and prayer, knowing it's a pathway to restoration and peace.

### Devotional: Rest for the Weary Through Dependence

Dependence on God and others can sound daunting for those accustomed to self-sufficiency. Yet Jesus invites the weary to come to Him for rest—an invitation to release burdens and find peace.

John's declaration that we can do nothing apart from Christ reminds us that dependence is actually life-giving. It aligns us with the source of all strength and purpose.

Psalm 62 encourages pouring out our hearts to God continually, modeling trust that supports vulnerable expression and receiving help.

Embracing this peace means choosing reliance over isolation, knowing God works in and through community as well as personal prayer. Today is about letting go and entering divine rest that heals and renews.

### Devotional: The Balance of Serving and Receiving

True community flourishes when each person both gives and receives support. Romans urges us to share with those in need and practice hospitality, emphasizing generosity and openness.

Peter teaches that our gifts are meant for serving others, highlighting the beautiful balance of offering support and accepting it gracefully.

The early church modeled this well, pooling their resources and lives for mutual care and encouragement.

For veterans and believers alike, learning to receive help can be as transformative as serving. Both acts break down isolation and build lasting bonds.

Today, reflect on how you can give support through your gifts and how you might also create space for others to support and pray for you.

- Psalm 27:14 "Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord."







### Devotional: Step Boldly Into Healing Community

Stepping into vulnerability, connection, and community requires courage. Joshua's charge to be strong and courageous applies to our spiritual journeys as well, especially when breaking down barriers of pride and isolation.

God's promise to be with us dispels fear and discouragement as we reach out for help and pray for support. Isaiah echoes this assurance, reminding us we are not alone.

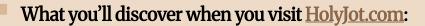




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
