1 Corinthians 7:7 - "I wish that all of you were as I am. But each of you has your own gift from God; one has this gift, another has that."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 19:12 "For there are eunuchs who were born that way, and there are eunuchs who have been made eunuchs by others... and there are those who choose to live like eunuchs for the sake of the kingdom of heaven."
- Romans 12:6 "We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us."







Devotional: Singleness as a Divine Gift and Calling

On the first day, we explore Paul's clear statement that singleness is a gift. In 1 Corinthians 7:7, Paul expresses a heartfelt wish that all might live as he does, singleness included, to devote themselves fully to God. Singleness in Paul's teaching is not a default state or unfortunate circumstance but a unique calling and gift from God.

This gift can be deeply liberating. It frees believers from the concerns and divided interests that sometimes come with marriage, allowing a focused devotion to God's work. Jesus' words in Matthew 19:12 reinforce this, noting some choose singleness "for the sake of the kingdom." Paul invites us to view singleness intentionally, embracing God's design rather than societal pressure.

Reflect on the diversity of gifts God gives (Romans 12:6) and consider how singleness fits into this divine variety. It is a status charged with potential for service, growth, and intimacy with God, uniquely tailored to each person's calling. Today, let us begin opening our hearts to see singleness as a powerful spiritual gift.

Day 2: Freedom and Responsibility in Singleness

Your Verse

1 Corinthians 7:32–34 – "An unmarried man is concerned about the Lord's affairs—how he can please the Lord. But a married man is concerned about the affairs of this world—how he can please his wife."

Supporting Scriptures

- Ecclesiastes 4:6 "Better one handful with tranquillity than two handfuls with toil and chasing after the wind."
- Philippians 4:11–12 "I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances."







Day 2: Freedom and Responsibility in Singleness

Devotional: Freedom to Serve and Responsibility to Steward

Today, Paul highlights the freedom and responsibility that come with singleness. An unmarried person can focus fully on the Lord's affairs without divided interests. This doesn't mean marriage is bad, but singleness allows a unique dedication to spiritual matters and ministry.

Paul's words remind us that singleness can provide a freedom to serve that married life might not easily allow. However, with this freedom comes responsibility to steward time, energy, and gifts wisely. Ecclesiastes 4:6 reminds us it is better to have less with peace than much with stress. Singleness can be a peaceful, contented season if approached with gratitude and faith, as Paul's example of contentment in Philippians teaches.

Are you using your singleness to focus more deeply on God's work? What responsibilities come with this freedom? Embracing freedom responsibly leads to fruitful, meaningful living that glorifies God regardless of marital status.

Day 3: Passionate Devotion without Distraction

Your Verse

1 Corinthians 7:35 – "I am saying this for your own good, not to restrict you, but that you may live in a right way in undivided devotion to the Lord."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 27:4 "One thing I ask from the LORD...that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life."
- Colossians 3:23 "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord."







Day 3: Passionate Devotion without Distraction

Devotional: Living with Undivided Devotion to God

Paul encourages single believers to pursue "undivided devotion to the Lord." Singleness can be a powerful opportunity to deepen passion and zeal for God without the distractions that often accompany family responsibilities. This does not diminish marriage but celebrates the unique spiritual focus possible in singleness.

Psalm 27:4 reflects a heart fully fixed on God's presence as the highest delight. Colossians calls us to wholehearted effort in everything, for God's glory. Applying these truths to singleness means living with intentionality—nurturing intimacy with God first and giving our best energy to His kingdom.

Are there distractions you need to set aside to live in right ways before God? How can you cultivate a passionate devotion that shapes your attitudes, priorities, and actions? Today, lean into the blessing of singleness as a season for spiritual growth and service with undivided hearts.

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Devotional: Experiencing God's Strength and Contentment

Paul's testimony in Philippians reveals the secret to contentment and strength in all circumstances, including singleness. He learned to be satisfied not by external conditions but by relying on Christ's power. Singleness can be challenging emotionally or socially, but God provides strength and grace sufficient to face every moment.

Psalm 46 reminds us God is our ever-present help and refuge. When singleness feels lonely or difficult, God's presence is our comfort and strength. Likewise, in 2 Corinthians 12, Paul shares how God's power is perfect in our weaknesses, turning challenges into opportunities for God's glory.

Today, receive God's strength and choose contentment in your current stage. Trust that His grace meets every need and transforms trials into powerful testimonies of faith and perseverance.

Your Verse

1 Corinthians 7:34 – "An unmarried woman or virgin is concerned about the Lord's affairs: Her aim is to be devoted to the Lord in both body and spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works..."
- Romans 12:1 "Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship."







Day 5: 🎇 Living Purposefully for God's Glory

Devotional: Wholehearted Devotion and Purpose in Singleness

On this final day, Paul focuses on purposeful living as the core of singleness. Unmarried believers have the opportunity to devote themselves wholly "in body and spirit" to the Lord's affairs. This devotion is not passive but active, calling for intentional, holy living that glorifies God.

Ephesians 2:10 reminds us each believer is crafted by God for good works prepared in advance. Singleness can be the fertile ground for discovering and fulfilling these purposes. Romans 12 emphasizes offering ourselves as living sacrifices, a daily surrender in worship through purposeful actions.

Are you living your singleness with intentionality and devotion to God's calling? Today is an invitation to commit your entire self—body and spirit—to serving Him with joy, recognizing your singleness as a vital season for kingdom impact. Walk forward confident that your life, single or not, can shine bright for God's glory.
