#### Devotional: Finding Purpose and Peace in Singleness

**Singleness is a unique calling** designed by God that often allows for undistracted devotion to Him. In 1 Corinthians 7:32–35, Paul emphasizes the freedom and focus of an unmarried person to serve God wholeheartedly. This season offers precious opportunities to deepen your relationship with God without the divided interests that come with marital responsibilities.

Yet, it is natural to sometimes feel isolated, especially when closest friends marry and embark on new lifestyles. That feeling is valid, but it shouldn't diminish your joy or purpose. Remember that God delights in you (Psalm 37:4) and has distinct plans for your life (Jeremiah 29:11), whether single or married.

*Embrace your present season* by seeking God's will daily and trusting Him to fulfill your heart's desires in His perfect timing. This perspective brings peace amid longing and enables you to focus on growth, service, and authentic friendships that transcend marital status.

#### Devotional: Cultivating Loving Fellowship Across Seasons

**Fellowship is vital** regardless of marital status. Romans 12:10 calls us to honor and love each other deeply, inviting you to find ways to build genuine relationships with your married friends. These friendships require intentionality, empathy, and respect for differing life rhythms.

Married friends may have new priorities and busyness, but the heart of fellowship remains connection, encouragement, and mutual support. Ecclesiastes 4:9 reminds us of the strength found in companionship, emphasizing that diverse relationships enrich our spiritual journeys.

Think creatively about fellowship. It might mean embracing their family gatherings, inviting them for coffee times, or sharing prayers during challenging seasons. Mutual care fortifies both single and married beliefs, showcasing God's unity beyond life circumstances.

Hold tightly to your identity in Christ. Your worth and joy come from Him alone, not your relationship status. Regular prayer, scripture reading, and worship will guard your mind and emotions, enabling you to celebrate your singleness confidently and lovingly engage with friends in all seasons.
