Devotional: God's Choice Validates Your Leadership

Just as He empowered Deborah, a courageous judge and leader, He calls you to step forward with confidence.

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 NIV – "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.

Supporting Scriptures

- Exodus 4:10-12 God reassures Moses of His help despite Moses' weakness
- Philippians 4:13 'I can do all this through him who gives me strength.'







Day 2: 39 Strength in Weakness: Finding Power in God

Devotional: God's Strength Shines Through Our Weakness

Insecurity thrives where we rely solely on ourselves. But God invites us to welcome our weaknesses so His strength can shine through. Paul's words to the Corinthians remind us that God's power is most evident when we feel insufficient.

Women leaders often feel pressure to 'have it all together.' However, surrendering our doubts and weaknesses to God unlocks His supernatural grace and strength in us. Moses struggled with feeling inadequate, yet God used him to deliver nations. Similarly, you do not need to rely on your own ability but lean on God's empowering presence.

When you acknowledge your weaknesses, you make space for Christ's strength to lead through you. Today, release your insecurities and embrace the grace and strength God offers for your leadership journey.

Devotional: Stand Firm: Courage in God's Presence

Insecurity often masquerades as fear and discouragement. Yet God's command to Joshua ushers leaders into a new reality: courage birthed from God's abiding presence. When you face moments of doubt or anxiety in your leadership role, remember that God accompanies you through every challenge and decision.

Leading as a woman might sometimes feel isolating or daunting, but Scripture encourages you to stand firm and courageous. Your confidence does not come from your ability to control outcomes but from knowing God will never leave your side.

Let the promises of God shape your leadership mindset today. Anchor yourself in His presence and allow courage to replace insecurity.
