#### Devotional: Walking in the Power of the Holy Spirit

**True outreach is Spirit-driven, not merely man-planned.** Jesus reminds His followers that the power needed to impact the world comes through the Holy Spirit. Men called to community outreach must rely on this supernatural enabling to overcome fear, cultural barriers, and personal limitations.

Being Spirit-led means staying sensitive to God's guidance moment by moment. It's an invitation to pray, listen, and obey, trusting that God moves through ordinary men to bring extraordinary transformation. Encourage men to cultivate intimacy with the Holy Spirit through prayer and study, so their efforts are fruitful and aligned with God's heart for the lost, the hurting, and the marginalized.

#### Devotional: Radical Love as the Core of Outreach

Jesus teaches that love is the greatest command, especially toward our neighbors. For men engaged in community outreach, this means stepping beyond convenience and comfort to genuinely care for those around them. Loving the city involves practical acts of kindness, empathy, and sacrificial service.

Pastors and leaders can inspire men to view neighbors broadly—people of all races, ages, and socioeconomic statuses in their city's mosaic. This love mirrors Christ's heart who reached out to the lost and marginalized. Challenging men to embody this love daily refines character and builds bridges where division and distrust exist.

Encourage men to listen more than speak, show genuine care, and invest time in others' lives. Building these Kingdom friendships requires patience and humility but yields deep fruit. The church becomes a family extending grace to all.
