# Empowered Mission: Lessons from Jesus Sending the Twelve



Explore Jesus' sending of the twelve apostles, focusing on mission, reliance on God, and the authority given to believers to carry His message.





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#### Introduction

Jesus' sending out of the twelve apostles marks a profound moment in the Gospels, where mission, dependence on God, and spiritual authority converge. In *Matthew 10:1–15*, we see Jesus empower His closest followers to step into the world with purpose and divine backing. This commission invites us to examine what it means to live sent by Christ — not by our own might but in God's strength and authority.

As believers today, we often wrestle with questions about our role in God's mission. How do we carry the Gospel with confidence? What does dependence on God look like in active ministry? How can we embrace the authority Jesus gives without pride or fear? This study will help you unpack these themes through Scripture and reflection.

Throughout this week, you'll journey through the account of Jesus sending the twelve, discover the keys to their mission, and see how their experience applies to your own walk of faith. **Be encouraged** to lean into God's power, carry the message of hope boldly, and grow in the authority Christ entrusts to you.

Prepare your heart for transformation and purpose as we dig into this vital gospel passage together.















#### Your Verse

Matthew 10:1 - "Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and sickness."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Luke 9:1 "When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases."
- Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses..."







#### Devotional: Called and Given Authority to Serve

Jesus didn't just send out His followers; He equipped them. Matthew 10:1 highlights that they were given authority to cast out demons and heal diseases. This authority wasn't for personal glory but for extending God's Kingdom on earth. It's a reminder that when God sends us out, He also empowers us.

As modern believers, we often underestimate the authority and power we've been given. The commission of the twelve challenges us to step out boldly, knowing God's Spirit is with us. But this empowerment requires faith and obedience — trusting that God equips what He commands.

Reflect on how God has called you. Do you recognize His authority working through your life? Remember that the mission is His, and He provides all you need to fulfill it.

#### Your Verse

Matthew 10:9-10 - "Do not get any gold or silver or copper to take with you in your belts—no bag for the journey or extra shirt or sandals or a staff..."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Philippians 4:19 "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus."
- Psalm 121:2 "My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth."







Day 2: 🥬 Dependence on God Alone

#### Devotional: Trusting God's Provision on Mission

Jesus' instructions to the twelve to travel lightly (Matthew 10:9-10) emphasize profound dependence on God's provision. They were called to leave behind material safety nets and trust God to meet their needs through the generosity of others and His divine care.

This model counters our modern tendency to self-sufficiency and control. God invites us into a mission where trust and faith replace security and planning. Dependence on God doesn't mean passivity but active reception — waiting expectantly and stepping forward knowing He provides.

Are you carrying heavy burdens or preparing for every outcome alone? What would it look like to release your grip and walk in daily dependence on God? Let this teaching challenge you to embrace God's provision as part of your mission mindset.



# Devotional: Proclaim and Demonstrate God's Kingdom

Jesus gave the twelve clear authority not only to preach but to demonstrate the Kingdom through healing and miracles. Their mission had words and works intertwined to authenticate God's power at work.

Today, believers continue this dual call — to proclaim the Good News and to bring tangible hope where there is brokenness. Healing can be physical, emotional, or spiritual. The authority Jesus imparts equips followers to minister wholistically.

Reflect on your ministry areas. Are you relying on God's authority to bring transformation? How might you partner with God to meet deep needs around you? Jesus calls you to pray and act boldly, confident that His power works through His followers.

- 2 Timothy 3:12 "In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted."







Day 4: V Facing Opposition with Faith

#### Devotional: Wise and Innocent in the Midst of Trials

Jesus prepared the twelve for opposition, warning them of the dangers ahead. The mission involves risk, yet He modeled a balance of shrewdness and innocence — wise in strategy but pure in heart.

As followers today, we too face opposition in various forms: rejection, misunderstanding, or spiritual attacks. God's Word encourages us to be wise and discerning, but also gentle and blameless. Faith does not guarantee ease but promises God's presence amid trials.

Reflect on challenges you face in your calling or faith journey. How can you embrace God's wisdom and purity? What steps can you take to stay rooted in faith while navigating opposition?

- Hebrews 13:2 "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers."







Day 5: fractional Hospitality and Community

#### Devotional: Opening Doors Through Hospitality

Jesus instructed the twelve to depend on the hospitality of those willing to receive them. This shows the importance of community and mutual support in God's mission.

Hospitality opens doors both physically and spiritually. For missionaries, it provided safety and a platform to share the Gospel. For us, being both guests and hosts in God's family fosters unity and encourages faith growth.

Consider how your own spiritual journey has been impacted by community and hospitality. How can you extend or receive hospitality as part of God's mission today?

Day 6: Proclaiming the Kingdom Boldly

#### Devotional: Courage to Share the Gospel Openly

Jesus urged the twelve to proclaim boldly what had been revealed to them. This call extends to all believers: the gospel is not meant to be hidden but shared openly and courageously.

Bold proclamation requires dependence on the Holy Spirit and overcoming fear. It's about loving others enough to share the truth clearly, even when risky.

Ask yourself, where might God be prompting you to speak boldly? Consider how the Spirit empowers you to overcome hesitation for the sake of the Kingdom.

#### Devotional: Faithful Ambassadors in God's Mission

The mission Jesus gave to the twelve included discerning when to stay and when to move on. Not everyone will receive the message, and believers are called to proceed faithfully without discouragement.

Living sent means embracing God's authority to represent Him well, even when facing rejection. It is a call to trust God's timing and sovereignty, knowing the mission continues beyond us.

As you close this study, reflect on your role as a sent one. How can you live daily with the authority and dependence Jesus modeled? What next steps is God nudging you toward in obedience and faith?
