Encountering Jesus: The Triumphal Entry and True Kingship



Explore Jesus' triumphal entry, unveiling His true kingship and challenging misplaced hopes through Luke 19:28–44 and related Scriptures.





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Introduction

The Triumphal Entry marks a pivotal moment in Jesus' ministry. As He approached Jerusalem, crowds gathered to welcome Him as their King, waving palm branches and crying out "Hosanna!" Yet, while the people expected a political liberator, Jesus came as the Messiah with a far different kingdom in mind.

This study invites you to journey through Luke 19:28—44 and related Scriptures, uncovering the profound truths about Jesus' kingship. We will explore the tension between popular expectations and God's real purpose—a kingdom not of this world, centered on salvation, justice, and peace.

Each day will guide you through Scripture, reflection, and prayer, helping you see how Jesus' entry into Jerusalem challenges us to consider what kind of King we truly follow. Are we hoping for earthly power or spiritual transformation? How does Jesus' example shape our understanding of leadership and hope?

Join us on this 7-day journey of discovery, where the crowds' shouts of "Hosanna" meet the deep call for repentance and faith. May this study deepen your connection with Jesus, the promised King who invites us to lay down our lives in His service and trust in His eternal reign.

Day 1: Welcoming the King

Devotional: Recognizing Jesus' Arrival as King

On this first day, we focus on the joyful, vibrant scene as Jesus enters Jerusalem. The crowds shout "Hosanna!" and lay down their cloaks and branches to welcome Him. They see Jesus as a deliverer who will free them politically and socially, fulfilling their deep hopes.

Yet Jesus rides on a humble donkey, fulfilling prophecy yet signaling a kingdom unlike any other. His kingship is one of peace and salvation, not military might.

What does it mean to welcome Jesus as King in our own hearts today? Like the crowd, we can enthusiastically praise Him, but also must understand His mission beyond our expectations.

- Zechariah 9:9 The prophecy of the King coming humble to Jerusalem







Devotional: God's Word Comes Alive in Jesus' Entry

The shouts of the crowd — "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" — echo the words of Psalm 118, connecting Jesus to God's promises. The Triumphal Entry is much more than a historic event; it is a divine fulfillment of prophecy and God's plan of redemption.

Jesus is the promised King, but His kingdom isn't one we might expect. It transcends earthly politics and conflict, pointing to a reign grounded in God's justice, mercy, and truth.

Recognizing Jesus as the fulfillment of prophecy invites us to trust in God's promises even when His ways surprise us. It challenges us to reconcile our hopes with God's greater purposes — to seek His kingdom above all.

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 21:10-11 The crowds ask who Jesus is, expecting a political Messiah
- Jeremiah 31:31–34 God promises a new covenant despite Israel's failures







Day 3: (2) Misplaced Expectations in the Crowd

Devotional: When Expectations Miss the Mark

While the crowd celebrates, Jesus weeps. He knows that many expect a king who will overthrow their oppressors, but they miss His true mission. The people's hopes are misplaced, focusing on temporal freedom rather than eternal salvation.

This tension is heart-breaking. Jesus' love for Jerusalem reveals His desire for their repentance and peace, yet their resistance leads to judgment.

How do our own expectations sometimes miss God's greater plan? Are we so focused on immediate solutions that we overlook His deeper work? **Jesus** invites us to realign our hearts with His vision — a kingdom of grace that transforms from within.

Reflect and Apply

What are some ways you have misunderstood or expected God to act differently?
How can Jesus' lament over Jerusalem teach us compassion for those who don't yet know Him?
How might you invite God to reshape your hopes to align with His kingdom?

Devotional: Embracing the Kingdom's True Nature

Jesus' kingdom is not defined by earthly power but by peace, justice, and joy. As the crowd praises Him, they echo a deeper truth that His reign brings heavenly peace and glory.

Isaiah's prophecy describes a ruler whose kingdom never ends, full of justice and righteousness — qualities we see embodied in Christ's life and teachings.

Reflect on how living under Jesus' kingship impacts your daily life. We are called to promote His peace and work for justice, reflecting heaven's reality on earth.

Devotional: The Seriousness of Rejecting the King

Though welcomed, Jerusalem's leaders and people largely reject Jesus' kingship, leading to a warning of judgment. Jesus foretells the city's siege, a consequence of their resistance to God's Messiah.

This reminds us that rejecting Jesus and the kingdom He offers has serious implications. The kingdom includes mercy but also calls for accountability and reverence for God.

Consider the seriousness of where you stand with Jesus today. Are you open to His rule or resisting His lordship?

	What does Jesus' warning teach about the consequences of rejecting Him?
2.	How can reverence for God shape your everyday decisions and attitudes?
3.	In what areas do you need to surrender more fully to Jesus' authority?

Day 6: Q Living as Citizens of the Kingdom

Devotional: Reflecting Kingdom Values in Life

Jesus continued teaching about the kingdom even as opposition grew. Those who follow Him are called to live out kingdom values daily, becoming salt and light in a world that so desperately needs truth and hope.

Our citizenship is not merely earthly but heavenly. This transforms how we view work, relationships, and challenges, embodying Jesus' teachings in practical ways.

Devotional: Awaiting the Full Realization of His Kingdom

While Jesus' first coming was marked by humility, His final return will be glorious and triumphant. Revelation paints a vivid picture of Christ returning as the King of kings and Lord of lords, fully manifesting His eternal reign.

Our hope is anchored in this promise — that one day every knee will bow and every tongue confess Jesus is Lord, bringing justice and restoration to all creation.

Living in this tension between 'already' and 'not yet' kingdom calls us to faithful waiting and active discipleship. We join with the crowds today in praising Him—Hosanna! Blessed is the King who comes!
