### Devotional: Facing Death with God's Comforting Presence

**Death has long been a subject of deep reflection and mystery.** The Bible opens with the reality of human mortality but also carries a thread of hope throughout its story. The question posed by Job, "If someone dies, will they live again?" captures an essential human longing for assurance beyond this life.

From the very beginning, Scripture acknowledges death's inevitability but invites us to consider the reality of life after death. Job wrestles with this in his pain, reflecting the tension many feel when facing death. Yet the biblical narrative also reveals that God often grants foresight—visions or revelations—to his faithful servants, bolstering their hope and preparing them for eternity.

Psalm 23 beautifully depicts God's presence even through "the darkest valley," a metaphor for the journey through death, assuring us that fear has no place when God walks with us. As we begin this study, take time to consider your own thoughts on death and what biblical hope might mean for you.

### Devotional: Prophetic Visions: Hope Beyond the Grave

The Old Testament contains some of the most vivid examples of *pre-death* or divine visions—glimpses into heavenly realities given to prophets at pivotal moments. Isaiah's vision of the Lord seated on His throne came during a time of upheaval and change, reminding us that God's sovereignty transcends even death and earthly transition.

Daniel's vision of "one like a son of man" points forward to the Messiah's victorious reign, encouraging believers that death is not the end. Ezekiel's detailed, awe-inspiring vision reveals heavenly glory and the presence of God amidst trials.

These Old Testament visions reflect a consistent biblical truth: God reveals Himself to His people as a source of hope and assurance, even in the face of mortality. These experiences were not just revelations but also callings that strengthened faith and preparedness for what lay beyond.

### Devotional: Jesus: Our Hope Beyond Death

Jesus' teachings bring clarity and hope to the mystery of death by personally overcoming it through His resurrection. When Jesus tells Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life," He declares Himself the source of eternal life and victory over death's power.

He assures His followers that Heaven is not a distant or abstract hope but a real home with many rooms prepared just for them. This promise offers great comfort, especially to those grieving or contemplating their own mortality.

At the same time, Jesus' teaching about eternal punishment reminds us that choices made in this life have eternal consequences. His message challenges us to live in readiness and faith, embracing His gift of salvation.

Jesus reframes death not as a final ending, but a transition into everlasting life with God, filled with hope and peace.

### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Philippians 1:23 "I desire to depart and be with Christ..."

### Devotional: Longing for Paradise with Christ

The Apostle Paul experienced a profound spiritual revelation—a vision of paradise—which he describes cautiously, knowing the limits of human language to capture heavenly glory. Yet in his writings, he expresses a deep longing to "depart and be with Christ," viewing death as a gateway to the fullness of joy in God's presence.

Paul's writings also emphasize the hope that God will one day wipe away all sorrow and pain, highlighting the ultimate restoration awaiting believers. These glimpses serve to encourage us that even amid trials and suffering, our future in Christ is secure and joyful beyond measure.

Paul's vision reminds us that though death is real and often painful, it ushers believers into a glorious eternal life prepared by God.

### Devotional: God's Strength When Our Strength Fails

Approaching the end of life can evoke vulnerability and uncertainty. The psalmist's words provide profound comfort: though our physical strength fades, God remains our eternal strength and portion. This means that in our weakest moments, God upholds us and holds us close.

Isaiah assures us that death can be a peaceful rest for the faithful, and Romans teaches that life and death alike belong to the Lord. This knowledge frees believers from fear and anchors us in God's sovereignty.

Trusting in God's presence at the final moments brings peace and hope, knowing that death is not abandonment but entry into eternal communion with Him.

The closing chapters of the Bible paint a breathtaking picture of God's ultimate plan: a new heaven and new earth where death, pain, and sorrow are no more. This vision signals the complete restoration of all things and the fullness of eternal life with God.

John assures believers that eternal life begins now in the moment of trusting Jesus, providing a foretaste of this future reality. Paul's triumphant declaration that death has been swallowed up in victory resonates like a victorious anthem over the grave.

This promise challenges us to live with eyes fixed on eternity, confident that what awaits far surpasses any earthly struggle or loss.
