

Your Verse

Matthew 24:1—3 – Jesus left the temple and sat on the Mount of Olives, where his disciples asked about the end times.

- Mark 13:3 And as he sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John and Andrew asked him privately, 'Tell us, when will this happen?'
- Luke 21:7 They asked him, 'Teacher, when will these things happen?' And what will be the sign that they are about to take place?'







Devotional: Preparing Our Hearts to Listen and Watch

Jesus' discourse begins with the disciples' questions—eager to understand the significance of the temple's grandeur and what future events lie ahead. As Jesus sits facing the temple from the Mount of Olives, His words bridge both the grandeur of the present and the prophetic future. This setting is crucial; it shows the disciples' desire to grasp God's unfolding plan.

Whether we face uncertainty, challenges, or questions about the future, Jesus invites us to be watchful and attentive to His prior warnings and promises. The disciples' inquiry reminds us it is natural to seek understanding amid turmoil. Yet, Jesus' response smooths the path toward spiritual readiness rather than just intellectual knowledge.

As we begin this journey, consider your own questions about the future and God's plan. Are you ready to listen, watch, and trust Jesus with the unknown? This is the posture of faith that sets the foundation for perseverance.

- Luke 21:11 There will be great earthquakes, famines and pestilences in various places, and fearful events and great signs from heaven.







Day 2: <u>A</u> Signs of Deception and Tribulation

Devotional: Seeing Through Deception While Facing Trials

Jesus cautions His disciples against deception. False teachers and counterfeit messiahs will arise to mislead many. The signs He lists—such as wars, famines, and natural disasters—are described as "birth pains," signaling that more difficult times are coming but that God's plan is unfolding.

It's easy to see these signs and feel overwhelmed or fearful. But Jesus' teaching isn't to incite panic—it's to prepare us. Being vigilant means knowing the reality and trusting God's control amid unseen spiritual battles. The growing challenges in the world underline the urgency to remain anchored in Christ, discerning truth from deception.

Reflect on your own spiritual vigilance. How are you guarding your heart against false teaching? What foundation anchors you in times of tribulation? Remember that Jesus assures His followers that perseverance is possible through His power and love.

- Romans 10:18 But I ask: Did they not hear? Of course they did: 'Their voice has gone out into all the earth.'







Devotional: Faithful Witness in the Midst of Persecution

Jesus prophesies intense persecution and widespread lawlessness. Believers will face hatred, betrayal, and trials for their faith. Yet, He also gives an amazing promise: the gospel will be preached throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations before the end comes.

This juxtaposition of hardship and hope challenges us to live boldly. When the world around us seems darkened by discord and evil, God's light continues to shine through the witness of His people. Our perseverance is vital to fulfilling the Great Commission in these turbulent times.

Devotional: Living Expectantly Amid Uncertainty

Jesus reveals the chilling phrase "abomination of desolation" as a sign for believers to flee and prepare for severe tribulation. The great distress that follows is unlike anything seen before. Amid these terrifying events, the timing of Jesus' return remains unknown, coming suddenly "like a thief in the night."

This mystery requires believers to live with constant readiness and trust—a daily commitment to faith and holy living. Even if we do not understand the exact sequence of events or the timing, we trust the One who holds the future.

How do we live in expectancy without fear? By focusing on the hope of Christ's return and making His kingdom our priority. This trust fuels perseverance, enabling us to face hardships with courage and peace.

- 1 Thessalonians 4:16—17 The Lord will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first.







Devotional: Hope Anchored in the Promise of Christ's Return

After the tribulation, Jesus describes dramatic signs in the heavens—darkened sun, moon not giving light, stars falling—the cosmic upheaval announcing His return. This is followed by a powerful gathering of His elect, a moment of ultimate hope and restoration.

These signs remind us that God's kingdom will be fully established with the return of Jesus. The disturbances in nature emphasize that the current world order is passing, making way for a new heaven and earth.

In the midst of uncertainties, this promise comforts believers: our hope is secure, our Savior is coming, and He will gather us to Himself. Such knowledge fuels endurance and daily faithfulness.


