Psalm 119:105 describes the Word as a lamp and light, guiding believers in truth and holiness.

Hebrews 4:12 highlights the living, active nature of God's Word, piercing to the heart and discerning intentions.

Any vision or prophetic message must be tested against Scripture. This protects the church from error and keeps believers rooted in the eternal truth of God's revelation. Prioritizing Scripture fosters clarity and confidence amid spiritual phenomena.
