- Psalm 42:11 "Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God."







Devotional: Hold Hope Firm as Your Soul's Anchor

Hope is a powerful anchor that stabilizes us amid life's storms, including the stresses of academic life. When assignments overwhelm and doubts creep in, holding onto hope in God steadies your soul and rewires your perspective towards endurance.
