#### Devotional: Renewing Our Strength Through Hope

**Endurance begins with hope.** Isaiah reminds us that waiting on the Lord renews our strength. Addiction recovery can be draining—for those recovering and those supporting them. The journey often feels like running a long race that saps our energy.

Yet, God promises that those who place their hope in Him will experience renewed strength. This renewal is vital for addiction counselors and supporters who need patience to walk with others through difficult days.

Hope in the Lord is not wishful thinking; it is a confident expectation in God's faithfulness. When you feel weary, remember that your strength is not your own but granted by God. This day, ask yourself: Are you placing your hope fully in the Lord, even when progress seems slow?

Remember Paul's encouragement in Galatians 6:9—do not grow weary in good works. Your endurance is tied to the promise of a harvest. Keep running with patience and trust God's timing.

#### Devotional: Growing in Patience Through Perseverance

**Patience is essential in addiction counseling.** Recovery rarely follows a straight or quick path. There will be steps forward and steps back. James encourages believers to let perseverance complete its work, making us mature and whole.

This maturity is exactly what counselors and supporters need. The endurance of patience helps us remain steady through the slow transformation process others undergo. It is the fruit of love and faith, a commitment to walk beside people faithfully, no matter how lengthy the journey.

Patience doesn't mean passive waiting. It means active, hopeful endurance—joyfully hoping, patiently suffering, and faithfully praying even when results are not immediately visible.

Through God's grace, cultivate patience that encourages rather than condemns, that listens rather than judges, and that gently corrects with careful instruction, as Paul advises Timothy. Your patient presence could be the very thing God uses to bring healing over time.

#### Devotional: Standing Firm on God's Truth

**Truth is the anchor of endurance in addiction counseling.** As supporters, we face many falsehoods — lies of shame, hopelessness, and deception that hinder recovery. Jesus said that knowing the truth sets us free.

It is essential that both counselor and counselee are grounded in God's truth. The Apostle Paul commands us to stand firm with the belt of truth as part of our spiritual armor. This truth provides strength and protection, enabling us to endure challenges without wavering.

God's Word lights our path. It illuminates the way forward so we don't stumble in darkness or confusion. When counseling those struggling with addiction, constantly return to Scripture. Let God's truth guide your speech, actions, and prayers.

Endurance built on truth doesn't ignore difficulties but faces them honestly with God's promises. It is truth that breaks chains and empowers transformation. Reflect on how deeply you rely on Scripture as your foundation and how you can better impart this truth to those you counsel.

#### Devotional: Endurance Through Compassionate Care

**Endurance is fueled by compassion.** Supporting someone in addiction recovery requires clothe ourselves daily in kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Without compassion, endurance can become mechanical or hollow.

Jesus empathizes with our weaknesses and sets the perfect example of compassionate support. As counselors, we cannot rush healing or force change; instead, we offer presence, encouragement, and understanding.

Compassion strengthens endurance by reminding us that we are partners, not just taskmasters, in another's healing process. Patience wrapped in kindness opens doors where harshness would close them.

Encourage yourself and others by building a culture of support. Praise even small victories, listen without judgment, and be gently persistent. In this way, endurance becomes a shared journey woven with love, much like Christ's endurance for us.
