

Hebrews 12:1 - "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with endurance the race marked out for us."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:12 "Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life."
- Galatians 6:9 "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."







Devotional: Start Strong: Run Your Race with Purpose

Endurance begins with a clear focus on the race God has called us to run.

Church planting is not a sprint; it is a marathon marked by long seasons of preparation, challenges, and growth. Hebrews 12:1 reminds us that we are never alone. We are surrounded by a 'great cloud of witnesses'—those who have gone before us in faith. Their stories encourage us to 'throw off everything that hinders' and to strip away distractions that sap our energy.

The struggle to build faithfully requires burning away sin tendencies and unproductive worries that slow us down. James affirms that perseverance under trial is honored by God. When setbacks come—and they will—remember that faithful endurance is itself a victory. The promise in Galatians encourages you not to grow weary because perseverance will yield a harvest.

Church planting struggles can sometimes feel isolating. But knowing God's Word assures us that endurance is not passive; it is an active discipline. Commit today to throw off anything hindering your progress, and focus on the race God has marked out for your ministry. *Your efforts will bear fruit in His perfect timing.*

Your Verse

Romans 5:3-4 - "Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 "We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed."
- James 1:2-3 "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance."







Devotional: Embracing Trials as Growth Opportunities

Trials are inevitable in church planting, but they are also opportunities for growth. Romans 5:3–4 teaches us to 'glory' or rejoice even in sufferings because they produce perseverance, and perseverance builds character and hope. When church planters face obstacles like limited resources, opposition, or slow progress, these hardships are refining the inner qualities God desires.

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians reassure us that pressure doesn't have to mean defeat. Even when feeling hard pressed or perplexed, we can hold onto the fact that God isn't letting us be crushed or destroyed. Instead, He is using trials to shape us.

James encourages believers to adopt a joyful attitude in the midst of testing. This joy comes from trusting that God's refining process produces perseverance—a key ingredient in building a strong ministry foundation. When you shift your perspective on trials as growth catalysts, endurance becomes not merely surviving but thriving spiritually through every challenge.

Prayer for Today

Isaiah 40:29 - "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:13 "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."
- Nehemiah 8:10b "...for the joy of the Lord is your strength."







Day 3: ① Strengthened by God's Power

Devotional: Rely on God's Strength, Not Your Own

Endurance isn't relying on our own ability but on God's power to sustain us. Church planting can leave us weary, drained, or doubting if our efforts are enough. Isaiah 40:29 offers encouragement: God gives strength to those who

feel weak and exhausted. When you have nothing left to give, His grace and power fill the gap.

Paul echoes this in Philippians 4:13, reminding us that through Christ, we are empowered to face every task and trial. This means our endurance is rooted in a divine resource, not human limitations.

Nehemiah understood this well as he led people to rebuild Jerusalem's walls amid opposition. He declared that joy in the Lord is strength — an inner wellspring that fuels perseverance.

For church planters, anchoring your endurance in God's power means acknowledging your limits but trusting His limitless ability. It requires regular renewal through prayer, worship, and dependence, so your ministry is powered by His strength, not your own weariness.

Prayer for Today



- Galatians 6:2 "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."







Day 4: 🎔 Encouragement in Community

Devotional: Building Endurance Through Community Support

No one endures church planting struggles alone; God calls us to community. Ecclesiastes reminds us that working together produces better results and protection. When the journey feels difficult and you stumble, having trusted partners can lift you up and encourage you.

Hebrews encourages the believers not to neglect gathering but to spur each other on—offering motivation and support through fellowship. It is easy for church planters to become isolated, but endurance grows stronger in community.

Galatians exhorts us to carry one another's burdens, sharing struggles so no one has to rely solely on themselves. This spiritual and emotional support nurtures resilience.

As you face the long seasons of church planting, invest in relationships that bring mutual encouragement and accountability. Lean into trusted mentors, peers, and your congregation. Together, you can withstand challenges that might overwhelm an individual.

Jesus compares obedience to building a house on the rock, secure against storms. The faithful planter commits to applying God's Word and teaching consistently.


