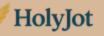

Day 1: 1 Standing Firm in the Face of Rejection

Your Verse

2 Timothy 4:5 – "But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry."

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 6:9 "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."
- James 1:12 "Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him."







Day 1: **(**) Standing Firm in the Face of Rejection

Devotional: Stand Firm: God's Strength in Evangelism Rejection

Evangelism requires courage and endurance, especially when faced with rejection. Paul's charge to Timothy reminds us that we must **keep our heads in all situations** and not be disheartened when sharing the gospel becomes difficult. The path of proclaiming Christ isn't always smooth — hardship will come, but the call is to *endure faithfully*.

Rejection can be painful and discouraging, but Scripture encourages us to see it as part of the journey, not the end. Galatians 6:9 reminds us not to grow weary because a harvest awaits. Our efforts may not yield immediate fruit, but God is at work in unseen ways. James promises that those who persevere through trials will receive a crown of life—a reward beyond earthly recognition.

Endurance in evangelism means standing firm, even when doors close and hearts harden. Our confidence rests not in our success but in God's faithfulness. When you face rejection, pause, pray, and remember the eternal significance of every conversation about Christ. Your witness counts, even if the moment feels discouraging.

Devotional: Keep the Flame Alive: Passion for Sharing Christ

Opposition can quickly dampen our zeal for evangelism, but Romans 12:11 calls us to **never lack zeal** and to maintain spiritual fervor. Our passion for serving the Lord fuels endurance in sharing Christ despite difficulties.

The apostles exemplified this attitude. Even after facing persecution and humiliation, they rejoiced because being counted worthy to suffer for Jesus was an honor. This perspective transforms obstacles into opportunities to witness His power and faithfulness.

To maintain passion, focus on your ultimate goal: Christ and His calling. Philippians reminds us to press on as athletes striving for a prize. We keep running not for earthly applause but for a heavenly reward. When rejection comes, remind yourself why you share: to glorify God and draw souls to Him.

Prayer, worship, and immersion in God's Word will fan the flames of your passion. Surround yourself with encouragement, and let the joy of the Lord be your strength.

Evangelism often comes with opposition—mockery, rejection, and even persecution. Yet, Peter encourages believers to rejoice because sharing in Christ's sufferings connects us deeply to Him and promises future glory.

Nehemiah reminds us where our strength comes from—the joy of the Lord. When rejections and setbacks weigh heavy, choosing joy keeps our hearts anchored. It's not superficial happiness, but a deep-rooted gladness grounded in God's presence and promises.

Finding joy in trials transforms our perspective, making endurance not just bearable but meaningful. Each hardship is a step closer to spiritual maturity and witnessing God's faithfulness in powerful ways.

Devotional: Empowered by the Spirit: Strength for Evangelism

Endurance in evangelism isn't something we muster on our own. Jesus promised the Holy Spirit's power to equip believers for witnessing to the world. Acts 1:8 highlights how the Spirit empowers us to bear witness, moving beyond fear and weakness to boldness and effectiveness.

We are chosen and appointed to bear lasting fruit, as John 15:16 assures. When rejection comes, it's easy to feel inadequate. But true strength comes from relying on God's mighty power, not our own abilities.

Day 5: **B** Enduring with Hope for Lasting Fruit

Devotional: Hopeful Endurance: Your Work Is Not in Vain

Endurance culminates in hope — hope that your efforts in evangelism are not wasted. Paul's words in 1 Corinthians encourage believers to stand firm and keep fully devoted because their labor is meaningful in God's economy, even if unseen.

Psalm 126 pictures sowing seeds with tears—moments of sadness and rejection—but promises a joyful harvest awaits. Evangelism often involves patient waiting, trusting God's timing and activity behind the scenes.

Running with perseverance means fixing our eyes on the eternal impact rather than immediate results. This hopeful endurance keeps us motivated and joyful amidst trials.

Reflect on the potential fruit God can produce through your faithfulness. Your continued obedience plants seeds for transformation, and God's timing will bring growth—often beyond what you imagine. Encourage yourself today with this truth: Your work for the Lord is never in vain.
