Devotional: Renewing Strength Through Patient Trust

Patience in financial waiting is a divine discipline. It's easy to become discouraged or tempted to take shortcuts when provision seems delayed. Yet Scripture encourages us to wait with strength and courage, placing our hope fully in the Lord.
