## Devotional: Relying on God's Strength When Caregiving Feels Hard

Caregiving for aging parents can be physically and emotionally exhausting. There are days when your own strength feels inadequate and your spirit is weary. Yet, God's Word promises that He provides strength specifically to those who feel weak. **Isaiah 40:29** assures us that God increases the power of the weak. This isn't a promise of our self–sufficiency but a powerful declaration of God's enabling presence.

When we acknowledge our limitations and invite God into our struggles, His grace becomes evident in our lives. The Apostle Paul experienced this deeply; his weaknesses became opportunities for God's power to shine through (2 Corinthians 12:9). Rather than feeling defeated by the weight of caregiving, we can lean into God's sustaining energy, knowing His strength is made perfect in our moments of weakness.

Today, reflect on your personal needs and ask God to infuse you with renewed strength. Trust that your endurance is not drawn from your own reserves but from a divine source that never runs dry. Caring for aging parents is a marathon, but with God's help, your love and energy will endure.

#### Devotional: Embracing God's Rest Amid Caregiving Responsibilities

#### Devotional: Developing Patience Through Spirit-Led Love

Long-term caregiving often challenges our patience. Situations can be unpredictable, health may decline, and emotions may run high. **Patience**, a fruit of the Spirit, is essential to sustain love over time. Galatians reminds us that patience is a divine gift cultivated as we remain connected to the Holy Spirit.

Love, described in 1 Corinthians 13, models patience as it endures difficulties without frustration or anger. This kind of love is intentional and reflects God's character. As caregivers, we are invited to grow in patience by allowing trials to mature our faith (James 1:3–4). Each challenge is an opportunity to respond with grace and gentle endurance.

When impatience arises, bring it to God in prayer and ask for Spirit-led wisdom. Pray that your love will not waver even when caregiving becomes strenuous. Remember that this patient love not only blesses your parents but also shapes your own spiritual growth and maturity.
