Devotional: Work Wholeheartedly for God's Eyes Only

Devotional: Renew Strength by Trusting God in Weakness

Endurance requires strength beyond our own capacity. Isaiah 40:31 offers a beautiful promise that those who hope in the Lord will have their strength renewed. In ministry, when exhaustion and discouragement threaten to steal our zeal, we are invited to rest in this hope.

God does not expect us to serve in our own power. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians remind us that God's grace is sufficient and His power shines brightest through our weakness. When we feel depleted, it is an opportunity to lean deeper into God's strength rather than relying on our own.
