Devotional: Receive God's Strength When You Are Weary

Day 2: V Steadfast Hope in Trials

Devotional: Anchor Your Parenting in Hope and Prayer

Hope is the anchor that keeps us steady when divorce threatens to shake our foundations. **Romans 12:12** instructs us to remain joyful in hope, patient through difficulties, and persistent in prayer. These three qualities form a cycle of endurance: hope lifts us, patience sustains us, and prayer connects us to God's empowering presence.

Devotional: Lead Your Children with Grace and Patience

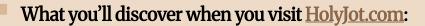
