Supporting Scriptures

Day 1: ① Strength Through God's Promise

Devotional: Finding Strength When You Feel Weary

Parenting rebellious children can leave you feeling drained and overwhelmed. It's easy to question your ability to persist. But God reminds us that He is the source of our strength, especially when we feel weak. **Isaiah 40:29** promises that God will give power to the weary. This doesn't mean the struggle disappears, but that you don't have to face it alone or in your own strength.

Prayerfully receive this truth today. Instead of relying on your own energy, seek God's strength. He is not distant but ever-present, ready to support you as you set loving but firm boundaries. Remember, endurance is a daily choice fueled by God's power, not your own willpower. Lean into His presence and let Him renew your spirit, so you can love and guide your children with patience.

As you reflect, consider what areas you feel weakest in parenting, and ask God to fill those gaps with His strength. **You are not alone.** He equips the weary parent to keep standing and loving.

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 12:11 'No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace.'







Day 2: W Loving Firmly, Setting Boundaries

Devotional: Balancing Love and Discipline in Parenting

Enduring rebellion isn't just about patience; it also requires clear, loving boundaries to guide children toward God's way. **Ephesians 6:4** encourages us not to provoke our children but to nurture them thoughtfully with godly instruction. This balance involves being firm without harshness — disciplining with love.

Setting boundaries is an act of love. It protects children and teaches them God's standards for life. While rebellion feels challenging, God calls us to patiently instruct and correct. Remember, discipline is sometimes uncomfortable but leads to peace and righteousness, as Hebrews 12:11 reminds us. This discipline is best when anchored in relationship, kindness, and consistency.

Today, ask God to help you lead your child with both grace and firmness. Reflect on ways to communicate boundaries that reflect God's love and truth. Persevere in parenting by remembering that your loving discipline points them to Jesus.

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 5:3-4 'Suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope.'
- Galatians 6:9 'Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.'







Devotional: Joyful Endurance Through Parenting Trials

Parenting rebellious children is not easy—it's filled with trials that test your faith and character. **James 1:2–4** calls us to consider these trials as opportunities to grow endurance. Challenges refine us, producing perseverance that leads to spiritual maturity.

Joy may sound strange in the midst of parenting struggles, but when we see these moments as chances to trust God and develop patience, we find new strength. Romans 5:3–4 encourages us that suffering is not wasted; it builds hope in our hearts. In parenting, each difficult encounter can deepen your ability to respond with grace.

Don't grow weary. Keep doing good, setting boundaries, loving, and praying. God is producing lasting fruit through perseverance. Lean into this truth and let it motivate you to endure with joy, knowing that great things are growing in your family.

- Proverbs 15:1 'A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.'







Devotional: Endurance Rooted in the Spirit's Fruit

Endurance in parenting rebellious children involves cultivating not just strength but also peace and patience. **Colossians 3:12–13** urges us to clothe ourselves daily with compassion and gentleness—qualities essential for maintaining loving boundaries without escalating conflict.

Patience grows when we depend on the Holy Spirit. The fruit of the Spirit includes peace and forbearance, enabling us to respond calmly rather than react in frustration. Proverbs 15:1 reminds us how a gentle answer can defuse anger and open hearts.

As you parent today, ask the Spirit to fill you with His fruit. Practice responding with kindness and humility, even when your child resists. This peaceful patience is a powerful form of endurance, showing God's love in action and helping heal rebellious hearts.

Devotional: Anchoring Hope to God's Faithfulness

Endurance culminates in holding fast to hope. Parenting rebellious children often feels like a long battle, but Scripture encourages us to keep faith and stand firm because God is faithful. **Hebrews 10:23** reminds us that our hope is secure in the One who never breaks His promises.
