#### Your Verse

#### Devotional: Renewing Your Strength Through Hope

#### Devotional: The Power of Patient Parenting

Patience is often one of the hardest virtues to practice when raising teenagers. Their quest for independence can feel like constant testing of boundaries and limits. Yet, James 1:4 reminds us that perseverance—patient endurance—produces maturity and completeness.

Parenting teens requires a gentle, humble spirit that chooses patience over frustration. Though it is easier said than done, *bearing with one another in love* means accepting imperfections, allowing room for mistakes, and extending grace even when your teen's behavior is challenging.

#### Devotional: Pressing On with Unwavering Faith

Endurance in parenting teenagers requires standing firm in your faith, even when times are tough or outcomes seem uncertain. Paul's words in 2 Timothy 4:7 encourage us to view parenting as a race and fight worth finishing. #### Your Verse

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Lamentations 3:22–23 "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."







Day 4: 7 Growing in Grace

#### Devotional: Embracing God's Power in Weakness

Parenting teenagers can reveal your weaknesses, whether patience, wisdom, or emotional control. Yet, God's grace covers every inadequacy. In 2 Corinthians 12:9, Paul shares a profound truth: God's power is made perfect in our weakness.

When you feel you don't have enough strength or answers, remember His grace is sufficient. Lean into God's ongoing provision of power and peace, and allow His grace to transform your parenting journey.

God becomes your refuge and strength in the storm, a constant source of help when troubles arise. His mercies are renewed every morning, reminding you to begin each day fresh with hope and grace to endure. Embracing God's grace means accepting both your limitations and His unlimited care and strength.
