# Endurance in Serving the Poor

#### Devotional: God's Strength Sustains Our Perseverance

**Serving the poor demands consistent effort**, and it can be tempting to grow weary when results seem small or setbacks arise. Yet Paul encourages us in Galatians 6:9 not to lose heart. God promises that perseverance will bring a harvest at the right time.

Reflect on areas where you may be feeling worn down in ministry. Are you tempted to give up? Let this passage remind you that faithful persistence honors God and advances His kingdom even when it's unseen.

Remember that your work is ultimately for the Lord (Colossians 3:23), not just human recognition. This perspective fuels zeal even in tough seasons.

When passion dips, remind yourself of 1 Corinthians 15:58: your labor isn't wasted. God is using your service for His eternal purposes.

Ask God to ignite fresh fire in your heart to serve with boldness and deep commitment every day.

3.	Pray for God to renew your heart to serve with enthusiasm.








Day 2: 6 Passion that Lasts

# Devotional: Serving Jesus Through Compassionate Endurance

Serving the poor is an expression of deep compassion that reflects Christ's heart. Matthew 25:40 reminds us that our service to those in need is service to Jesus Himself.

Endurance in ministry requires a sustained compassionate heart, not just a passing kindness. James 1:27 calls pure religion to active care for vulnerable people, emphasizing ongoing commitment.

Consider how endurance is shown through continual loving acts, even when they are unnoticed or thankless.

Hebrews 13:16 encourages believers not to forget to practice goodness and generosity — these habits strengthen endurance. Compassion fueled by faith empowers long-term service.

#### Devotional: Finding Strength When Discouraged

**Discouragement can be a heavy burden in long-term ministry.** The hardships, setbacks, or indifference encountered while serving the poor may crush the spirit.

Psalm 34:18 offers deep comfort: God is near to the brokenhearted and those who feel overwhelmed. His presence brings healing and renewed strength.

Nehemiah 8:10 calls believers to find joy in the Lord as a source of strength, even amidst difficulty. Philippians 4:13 reminds us that our ability comes from Christ's power.

When discouragement threatens to stop you, lean into God's nearness, find strength in His joy, and press forward. Endurance grows through dependence on Him in hardship.

#### Devotional: Anchoring Hope in Long-Term Service

**Endurance in serving the poor is sustained by a living hope.** James 1:12 promises blessing for those who persevere under trials and receive the crown of life.

Romans 5:3-4 teaches that suffering shapes perseverance, which builds character and ultimately hope. Ministry difficulties refine faith rather than destroy it.

Hebrews 12:1 calls believers to run with perseverance the race God set before them, looking to Jesus as our example and source of hope.

Let hope fuel your endurance today. Anchor yourself in the eternal reward and the character God is developing through your ministry.
