Devotional: Faith Starts With Consistent Teaching Seeded Early

Endurance begins with recognizing the lifelong impact of early teaching. Paul reminds Timothy that from infancy he had known the Scriptures, passed on faithfully by those before him. This speaks directly to the heart of discipling children—it is about *planting seeds* that may take time to sprout but will bear lasting fruit.

Teaching children God's Word requires patience and the long view of God's kingdom. Consistency means talking about God's truth throughout daily life, not just at set times. It means persevering in the face of distractions and setbacks, knowing that God's promises are sure.

As you embark on this journey, be encouraged that the Word you are faithfully sharing is powerful. The children you teach will carry these truths forward, even if you don't immediately see visible results. Your endurance is part of a larger story God is writing.

Devotional: Press On: Overcoming Weariness in Teaching

Endurance is often tested by obstacles that try to discourage us. When teaching children, you may face distractions, lack of interest, or feelings of failure. However, Paul urges us not to grow weary but to press on.

Perseverance means pushing through those tough moments, sustaining your commitment even when results seem delayed. The promise is clear: a harvest will come in due time.

When you hit difficult seasons in discipleship, remember it is a race, not a sprint. Each effort counts, no matter how small. God values faithfulness, not just immediate success. Keep running with endurance, relying on His strength to overcome fatigue and disappointment.

Devotional: Love and Patience: Keys to Lasting Discipleship

Endurance in teaching is fueled by love, humility, and patience. Paul exhorts believers to bear with one another in love, using gentleness as a key tool in discipleship.

Children learn best when they feel safe and loved, not pressured or overwhelmed. When teaching God's Word, patience allows the Holy Spirit to work at their own pace. Persistent love guards against frustration and bitterness.

Nurturing discipleship is a relational journey. It's about showing grace when children struggle, helping them understand God's truth over time, and modeling Christ's love daily. Your endurance is strengthened when you lead with a humble and tender heart.
