Day 1: X The Star Leads to Jesus









Your Verse

Matthew 2:9-11 "They saw the star and were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him."

Supporting Scriptures

- Numbers 24:17 "A star will come out of Jacob; a scepter will rise out of Israel."
- Psalm 72:10 "May the kings of Tarshish and of distant shores bring tribute to him."







Devotional: Guided by God's Light to Worship

The journey of the Magi shows us how God's light can guide seekers even from distant lands. The star they followed was a divine sign pointing to the true King. Their journey wasn't just physical but spiritual—a search for truth and hope in a world longing for salvation.

We, too, can look for God's guiding light in our lives. Maybe He reveals Himself through Scripture, prayer, or the encouragement of others. Like the Magi, when we find Jesus, worship naturally follows. They laid down their treasures as acts of reverence and submission, recognizing the true value of Christ above all else.

Devotional: Christ's Light Shines on Every Nation

God's promise through Isaiah paints a picture of a radiant light drawing nations together. This prophecy points to the Messiah whose arrival changes everything—the Light who breaks barriers of race, culture, and nation. His brightness is not limited to one group but shines to all people, inviting everyone to receive salvation.

John reminds us that Jesus is this True Light. He enters the world not just to guide but to transform. Whereas darkness represents separation from God and confusion, Jesus brings clarity and unity. Because of Him, no one is beyond reach; every nation has access to God's grace.

Embracing Epiphany means acknowledging that God's love extends universally. It calls the church to reflect that light by loving others across differences and working for peace. Day 3: 6 The Light Breaks Through Darkness

Your Verse

John 8:12 "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 27:1 "The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?"
- 2 Corinthians 4:6 "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' made his light shine in our hearts."







Day 3: 6 The Light Breaks Through Darkness

Devotional: Walking in the Life-Giving Light

In this passage, Jesus declares Himself as the light that dispels spiritual darkness. Darkness often symbolizes fear, confusion, and separation from God. But Jesus offers light that brings clarity, safety, and life. To follow Him means to leave behind the shadows of sin and doubt and walk confidently in His truth.

The Psalmist's declaration reveals this same confidence—because God is our light and salvation, there is nothing to fear. This assurance is available to everyone who trusts in Him. His light penetrates even the darkest places in our hearts, renewing us from within as Paul describes in Corinthians.

As we reflect today, consider areas of your life that feel dark or uncertain. Jesus invites you to bring those into His light. When we accept His guidance, we experience freedom and hope. Today is an opportunity to choose to walk in the light, embracing the truth and power of Christ that overcomes every shadow.
