Devotional: God's Unchanging and Sovereign Plan

Devotional: Messiah's Role in Israel's Redemption

The promised Messiah is central to Israel's eschatological hope. Paul's affirmation that all Israel will be saved reflects a future turning of the nation to their true Deliverer, Jesus Christ.

Zechariah's prophecy about mourning for the pierced one foreshadows Israel's recognition of Jesus as Messiah despite initial rejection, highlighted in John's Gospel.

This day invites you to ponder the patience and mercy of God as He calls Israel and the world to salvation through Christ, the fulfillment of all prophecy.

Devotional: God's Sovereignty Over Nations' Conflicts

Scripture reveals a climactic confrontation involving all nations centered on Israel. Zechariah's and Joel's prophecies describe a future time when nations will gather against Jerusalem, a pivotal event in God's end-time plan.

The Book of Revelation expands on this, referring to the battle of Armageddon, highlighting God's ultimate victory over earthly powers opposed to His kingdom.

Consider how these passages remind us that God reigns supreme over history and that the nations' hostility ultimately fulfills His purpose to establish peace and justice.
