Introduction

John 14:3 – "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

- Titus 2:13 "while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ."
- Acts 1:11 "This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."







Devotional: Living with the Hope of His Return

The promise of Jesus' return is the cornerstone of Christian hope and eschatological understanding. John 14:3 offers comfort as Christ assures His followers that He is preparing a place for us and will come again to take us home. This is not a vague hope but a sure and personal promise that shapes how we live today.

Day 2: O Signs of the Last Days









Your Verse

Matthew 24:6-8 - "You will hear of wars and rumors of wars... These are the beginning of birth pains."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Timothy 3:1-5 "People will be lovers of themselves... having a form of godliness but denying its power."
- Luke 21:25–26 "There will be signs in the sun, moon and stars... People will faint from terror."







Devotional: Recognizing God's Signals in Troubled Times

Jesus' words about the coming signs remind us to be vigilant and discerning. The signs described in Matthew 24 include wars, natural disasters, and moral decay—events that can cause anxiety but also signal the fulfillment of God's prophetic plan.

Paul echoes this in 2 Timothy, highlighting the spiritual and moral conditions characteristic of the last days. These signs show us not just external turmoil but also internal dangers: self-centeredness, lack of love, and spiritual deception.

Rather than fear, these warnings call the Church to readiness and increased faithfulness. As birth pains lead to new life, so these signs indicate that God's kingdom is coming closer. The Church's role is to remain steadfast, to hold to biblical truth, and to offer hope to a world in distress.

Consider how awareness of these signs impacts your role as a member of the Church. Are you prepared to stand firm in faith and serve as a beacon of hope amidst uncertainty?

Devotional: Holiness as the Church's Distinctive Mark

Amid the challenges and moral confusion of the last days, God calls His Church to holiness. 1 Peter 1:15–16 echoes the Old Testament call for God's people to reflect His character through holiness. This is not a burden but a privilege to live set apart for God's purposes.

Ephesians reminds us to imitate God's love, which expresses holiness in action. It is both inward purity and outward compassion that marks believers. Revelation highlights the pure witness of those faithful to Christ amidst a corrupt world.

Holiness shapes the Church's identity and mission, drawing others to the Gospel. It is a powerful testimony when the Church reflects God's character clearly. The urgency of the last days intensifies this call; holiness guards against deception and empowers effective witness.

Reflect on how your life demonstrates holiness. Are there areas where God is calling you to deeper devotion and purity? Remember, holiness is attainable by grace and is essential as the Church prepares for Christ's return.
