Devotional: The Trustworthy Light of Prophecy

Devotional: God's Eternal Kingdom Is Coming

Daniel's vision reveals God's unstoppable kingdom that will triumph over all earthly powers. This kingdom is eternal and unlike any human government. Jesus confirmed this truth by teaching that the gospel kingdom will be preached worldwide before the end comes.

Day 4: ∑ Signs Before the Return

Devotional: Recognizing Signs, Staying Prepared

Jesus taught that before His return, there would be various signs—troubles, natural disasters, and moral decay. These signs can seem frightening, but they also remind us to stay watchful and prepared.

Paul's words in 2 Timothy highlight that the last days will feature difficult times, marked by selfishness and unrest. Learning to recognize these signs helps believers remain spiritually alert and rooted in God's truth.

Rather than panic, God calls us to live with wisdom and boldness, sharing the gospel as light in a dark world. Signs don't indicate hopelessness but remind us that God's timing is perfect, and His kingdom is imminent.

Devotional: Christ's Return Brings Justice
