Introduction

Eschatology—the study of the end times—is often shrouded in mystery, speculation, and, sadly, misinformation. Many popular beliefs about end times, such as the exact timing of Christ's return, who will be saved, or what will happen during the tribulation, have origins more in speculation than Scripture. In this 7-day study, we will *debunk common myths* surrounding eschatology and replace them with clear, sound biblical doctrine.

Understanding what the Bible really says about the end times is not just a theological exercise—it impacts how we live today. The hope of Christ's return encourages us to live holy and godly lives, confident that God controls history and has a glorious plan for creation's restoration. This study will help you discern myth from truth by focusing on Scripture's key passages about the future, Jesus' promises, and the ultimate victory of God's kingdom.

Throughout the week, you will explore major eschatology topics such as the nature of Christ's return, the final judgment, the resurrection, and the new heavens and earth. You will be challenged to think critically about popular assumptions and to grow in your trust of God's Word. Prepare to be encouraged and equipped—not confused or fearful—as you gain a biblical perspective on the last things. Let's embark on this journey together, confident that God's Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path, even when exploring the profound truths about the end of days. \square

Acts 1:11 – "This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

Devotional: Trusting the Visible Return of Christ

Many myths about the return of Christ distort the clear teaching of Scripture. Some speculate about secret raptures or exact dates, but the Bible is straightforward: Jesus will return visibly and unmistakably. Acts 1:11 emphasizes that He will come back *in the same way* He ascended—publicly and gloriously.

This truth refocuses us from fear and speculation to watchfulness and hope. Jesus Himself told His disciples not to try to predict the day or hour but to live alert and ready (Matthew 24:36–44). The promise of His return is certain and sure, but the timing remains God's secret.

Instead of confusion and fear, we find peace in trusting God's sovereignty and living in light of Christ's promised return. This reality should inspire holiness, evangelism, and perseverance in the face of challenges, rather than obsession with timelines or scenarios.

Today's call is to anchor your faith in Jesus' clear promise, rejecting myths that distract from His real and glorious coming.

Devotional: Rejecting the Secret Rapture Myth

The popular idea of a secret rapture—Christ removing believers from earth before tribulation—has no strong biblical foundation. Instead, Scripture describes the return of Christ as a public, world-wide event where both living and dead believers are caught up to meet Him (1 Thessalonians 4:16–17).

Matthew 24:30 and Revelation 1:7 reinforce the visibility of this event; it will be unmistakable. This counters the myth that Christians will suddenly vanish in secret before difficult times.

This clear teaching encourages believers not to expect escape but to endure faithfully through trials, knowing Christ reigns and will return openly. It challenges believers to stand firm in faith with courage, not fear.

Embracing this truth frees us from preoccupation with secret withdrawals and focuses us on living faithfully through the challenges God allows, trusting His sovereign plan to ultimately restore all things.

Devotional: Embracing the Truth About Judgment

Many misunderstandings surround final judgment, leading to fear or misconceptions about God's justice and mercy. Revelation 20 gives a vivid picture: all the dead are judged fairly according to their deeds. This judgment includes the resurrection and eternal destiny.

Hebrews 9:27 reminds us of the inevitability of judgment after death, while 2 Corinthians 5:10 explains we will all stand before Christ's judgment seat to give an account.

This truth is not meant to produce despair but to encourage reverence, accountability, and gratitude for God's grace made available through Jesus. It clarifies that God's judgment is righteous and just, balancing mercy and holiness perfectly.

Knowing the certainty and fairness of final judgment calls us to repentance and motivates us to live lives pleasing to God, reflecting His character in word and deed.

1.	How does knowing that you will stand before Christ's judgment seat affect your daily decisions?
2.	In what ways does understanding God's justice and mercy bring balance to your view of judgment?
3.	What comforts you about the biblical picture of final judgment, and what challenges you?

Devotional: Hope Anchored in Resurrection Truth

The doctrine of resurrection is at the heart of biblical eschatology. The Bible promises that the dead in Christ will be raised imperishable, and believers will be transformed to glory at Christ's return (1 Corinthians 15:52).

John 5 reminds us that all will be raised—both to eternal life and judgment—emphasizing the power of Jesus' voice. Philippians 3 speaks beautifully of our future transformed bodies, like Christ's glorious resurrected body.

This truth dispels myths that only souls continue or that bodily resurrection is symbolic. It gives profound hope that death is not the end, and that God has prepared a real, physical new life for those who trust Him.

The resurrection hope encourages perseverance, comfort in loss, and a fresh perspective on both suffering and victory.

Devotional: Embracing God's Restoration Promise

An enduring myth is that heaven is merely a faraway spiritual realm we'll escape to, but Scripture reveals something far richer. Revelation 21 describes a new heaven and a new earth where God dwells with His people, free from pain, death, and sin.

Isaiah 65 and 2 Peter echo this powerful promise of cosmic renewal and restoration—far beyond mere individual salvation.

This vision shows God's plan for full restoration of all creation, inviting us to imagine a real, tangible future where God's presence fills everything and perfect peace reigns.

Understanding this biblical hope expands our view of eternity from a spiritual "escape" to a glorious restoration and renewal that will surpass all suffering and loss.

2.	In what ways does this hope shape your understanding of eternity beyond heaven as a spiritual realm?
3.	How can this vision inspire you to live with purpose and hope despite present struggles?

Reflect on how God's restoration plan impacts your daily priorities and relationships.
Write about how you can share hope for God's future with people around you.

Devotional: Living in God's Sovereign Plan

A common myth about eschatology is fatalism—the idea that we are powerless to influence anything because the end is fixed indisputably. While God's plan is certain, Daniel 2:21 reminds us He controls all times and events, orchestrating history according to His purposes.

Romans 8:28 assures believers that God works all things—even end-time events—for good. Ephesians emphasizes that everything unfolds according to God's will, inviting us to trust Him rather than despair.

This truth calls Christians away from passive resignation to active faith. Knowing God is sovereign encourages us to participate in His mission now, live faithfully, and pray with confidence.

Reject fatalism—embrace God's power working through you even as history moves toward its culmination.

Devotional: Hope and Holiness: Your Daily Calling

After exploring and debunking eschatology myths, the Bible calls us to a practical response: live holy and hopeful lives today. 2 Peter 3 challenges us that knowing the end of all things is coming should shape how we live each day.

Titus 2 highlights that our hope is centered on Christ's glorious appearing, not fear or speculation. 1 John frames this hope as motivation for purification and Christlikeness.

Instead of anxiety or fatalism about the end times, Scripture invites us to live with vibrant hope and holiness, shining as lights in a dark world.

This final focus reminds us that eschatology is not merely about future events but transforms how we love, serve, and witness now.

	How should the reality of Christ's return influence your daily habits and relationships?
	What changes can you make to pursue greater holiness motivated by hope?
	How can you encourage your community to live in hopeful anticipation rather than fear?
