#### Devotional: Four Beasts: Kingdoms Come and Go

Daniel's vision of four beasts rising from the sea depicts four kingdoms that will dominate the earth's stage. The lion, often linked to Babylon, symbolizes power and majesty but also ferocity. This imagery introduces us to how God uses vivid symbolic language to portray historical kingdoms.

Interestingly, Revelation 13 describes a beast combining features of a leopard, bear, and lion—linking John's vision to Daniel's four beasts to reveal a composite evil power opposing God's people.

Daniel 7:17 clarifies these beasts represent earthly kings or kingdoms, temporary in nature, contrasted with God's everlasting kingdom. Recognizing these symbols enhances our understanding of the spiritual and political dynamics at play in biblical prophecy.
