#### Devotional: Faith Defined: More Than Blind Belief

**Faith** is often labeled as irrational because it involves trusting in things unseen. Yet, the Bible defines faith as confidence and assurance—a trust rooted in hope and knowledge rather than guesswork or wishful thinking.

Hebrews 11:1 introduces faith as a firm foundation, something that stands even when the circumstances are unclear. Faith isn't the absence of reason; it's trust supported by the knowledge of God's promises. Romans 10:17 further clarifies that faith grows from hearing God's Word, which provides credible evidence for belief.

While Proverbs 3:5 encourages trust beyond our understanding, it doesn't promote ignoring reason but rather acknowledging God's wisdom surpasses our limited perspective. Faith, therefore, is a choice to rely on God's character and truth rather than solely on human logic.

Consider what it means for your own faith journey to have confidence in what you hope for—a conviction that moves beyond doubt into personal assurance grounded in God's nature.

#### Devotional: Faith Engages Reason, Invites Questions

Faith does not reject reason or inquiry; instead, Scripture invites us to **reason together with God**. Isaiah 1:18 demonstrates God's desire to engage in dialogue rather than force blind obedience.

The apostle Peter encourages believers to be ready to explain the reasons for their hope, acknowledging that faith involves intellectual engagement and thoughtful defense. This openness to questioning and examining evidences echoes the example of the Bereans in Acts 17:11, who searched Scripture to verify teachings.

Faith is strengthened, not weakened, by honest questions and discovery. It builds upon a foundation of truth examined with a sincere heart. Embracing both faith and reason enables a mature, resilient spirituality that can withstand doubt and criticism.

Ask yourself: Is your faith open to questions, or do you feel threatened when doubts arise? True faith invites exploration and reflects confidence.

### Devotional: Faith Anchored in Jesus' Resurrection Reality

Faith in Christ rests upon historical events documented with trustworthy evidence. 1 Corinthians 15:14–17 makes a strong claim: without Christ's resurrection, faith is futile. But history confirms that resurrection—transforming despair into hope.

John's gospel records signs and miracles to inspire belief, not merely spiritual feeling. The resurrection serves as the ultimate evidence validating Jesus' identity and mission.

Acts 2 recounts eyewitness testimony that Jesus was crucified under human authority yet raised by God's power—highlighting faith's rational basis grounded in historic fact.

Understanding faith as reliance on concrete historical truth invites believers to live confidently, knowing their hope isn't wishful thinking but reality.
